 On this the 9th day of February 1. D. 1897. The County Com-
 missioners Board of Titus County, convened in regular
 session at a regular term of said court to-wit. P. M.
 Roger County Judge, W. J. Bellfield Commissioner Precinct
 No - 1. J. S. Harper Commissioner Precinct No. 2. E. Y. Brown
 Commissioner Precinct No. 3. J. H. Hall Commissioner
 Precinct No. 4. being present, and passed the following order.
 It is ordered by the County Commissioners Board of Titus
 County that the Bonds of said County to be called Titus County
 Court house bonds to be issued under and by virtue of
 an act of the 28th Legislature, approved May 3rd 1893. entitled
 An act to authorize the County Commissioners Boards of the
 several counties of the State to issue Court House and jail
 and Bridge bonds or other, and to repeal all other laws
 authorizing the issuance of County Court House and jail and Bridge
 County Bridge bonds, for the purpose of building a
 Court House. Said bonds shall be numbered consecutively
 from 1 to 10 inclusive, shall be of the denomination of
 \$ 500.00 each, aggregating \$5000.00
 They shall be dated the 10th day of February 1897 - shall be
 come due and payable 10 years from date, but may
 be redeemed at the pleasure of the County, at any time
 after 10 years from said date. They shall bear inter-
 est at the rate of six per cent per annum payable
 semi annually on the 10th days of April and October
 of each year. Principal and interest shall be payable
 upon presentation and surrender of bond or proper
 coupons in lawful money of the United States. The County
 Treasurers office in the town of Mt Pleasant, Texas.
 The said bond shall be signed by the County Judge
 countersigned by the County Clerk and registered
 by the County Treasurer, and the seal of the Commission-
 ers Board shall be impressed upon each of them - but the
 signatures of the County Judge and County Clerk upon the
 coupons may be lithographed. If within orders by the
 court that to pay interest on said bonds and create a
 sinking fund sufficient to discharge them at maturity
 a tax of four mills on each one hundred dollars valuation
 of all taxable property, as annually assessed and levied
 and in said Titus County shall be annually

lived and collected on said property, and annually assessed and collected until said bonds with interest are paid and County is then now bound for the current year and for each succeeding year while said bonds are outstanding and the same shall be assessed and collected for the current year and annually hereafter, and applied to the purpose marked. Rogers County Judge of this County shall be authorized to take and have charge of said bonds & spending them investigation by his attorney General and upon their approval shall have authority to negotiate their sale and receive for the County the proceeds thereof.
