

June Court Term 1901

The State of Texas. Be it remembered that  
County of Titus of a special term of the Hon.  
County Commissioners Court  
of Titus County Texas, was begun and held at  
within and for said County at the court house  
thereof in the town of Mollhausen on the  
18<sup>th</sup> day of June A.D. 1901. Present and Presiding  
the Hon. P.H. Rogers County Judge, W.J. Bellfield  
H.C. Thomas, Cal Russell and W.M. King, County  
Commissioners of said County, and in attendance  
Sam Porter Sheriff in and for Titus County  
and Collin County Clerk. Whereupon the  
following proceedings were had to-wit:

In the matter of the assessment of June 18, 1901

the applications of P.B. King and Sarah J. Benson, for Confederate Pension under the act of May 17<sup>th</sup> 1899 passed by the 26<sup>th</sup> Legislature of the state of Texas. And it appearing to the Court that they the said P.B. King and Sarah J. Benson has complied with the requirements of the law, and that said parties are entitled to a pension under said act of the Legislature It is therefore ordered by the court that the said applications be and they are hereby approved and granted

In the Matter of the Act of <sup>3</sup> June 18 1901  
Sam Porter Sheriff, for <sup>3</sup> This day, came

Sam Porter Sheriff of Titus County, for the Board of prisoners and it appearing to the Court that said account is just and unpaid it is therefore ordered by the Court that said account be and the same is hereby allowed for the sum of Seventy Nine & 00 Dollars

for which the Clerk will issue warrant  
on General County fund to cover same.

In the Matter of Acct. of H.C. Thomas for letting Recieving Bridge on Andys Creek, June 18 1901.  
This day came on to hearing of said account he heard and examined the acct. of H.C. Thomas Co. Conn. for letting Recieving Bridge on Andys Creek, & says And is appearing to the court that said acct. is just and unpaid it is therefore ordered by the court that said account be and the same is hereby allowed and the Clerk will issue warrant on Road & Bridge fund for Six Dollars to cover same.

In the Matter of Repairing Jail & Court house Windows June 19 1901.  
It is ordered by the court that Sam Porter Sheriff be and he is hereby authorized to have repaired the County Jail and the Windows in the Tower of the Court house and when repaired, the Clerk will issue Warrant on his sworn statement, on Court house & jail fund to cover the amount shown in his, Sam Porter's, sworn statement of the expense of said repairs.

In the Matter of Reward June 19 1901  
of Court and Sheriff. It is ordered by the court that P.H. Rogers Co. Jady be allowed \$3<sup>00</sup> and H.C. Thomas, Cal Russell of Bellfield and W.M. King be allowed \$3<sup>00</sup> each for 2 days service holding Court and that Sam Porter Sheriff be allowed \$4<sup>00</sup> for waiting on Court, for which Warrant may issue on Genl. C. fund.

There being no further business before the  
Court it is ordered that Court do now  
adjourn until July 8<sup>th</sup> 1901 when  
it shall meet as Board of Liquidation
