In the Matter of the Petition of E.V. Broadstreet et al for Bridge May 12 1902
 on a Branch of Miles E. Cookville 3 this day It is
 ordered by the Court that Leal Russell
 he and he is hereby authorized to build
 Bridge as prayed for in said petition
 and that warrant issue on R.T.B. funds
 to cover expense of building same upon
 the order of Leal Russell Co. Commissioner.

In the Matter of Petition for Public Road May 13 1902
 of J. Benten et al P.H. Turner et al 3 this day
 Came on to
 be heard the petition of J. Benten P.H. Turner
 et al for a public road And it appears
 to the Court that due notice has been
 given as required by law and that
 the said road as described in said
 petition is a public necessity. It is therefore
 ordered by the Court that said petition
 be and the same is hereby granted
 and the following described boundary
 are hereby declared a public road
 to wit: Beginning at J. Benten on

McPheans and Winston road Thence by
G.W. Taliaferro - Thence by W.W. Garretson
Thence by Geo. Westbrook Thence by Sam
Barrett Then to intersect the County
road at Dr W.J. Hamilton, Thence to the

Burnett and 32 others, for an election to be ordered for Monticello School District No. 7, to determine whether or not a special Tax of 20 cents on the one hundred dollar worth of property shall be levied on the inhabitants of said school district or not. And it appearing to the Court that said petition was in due form and signed by the requisite no. of freeholders

of said School District. It is therefore ordered by the Court that said petition be and the same is hereby granted and an election is ordered to be held at Monticello in said School District on the 21st day of June ad. 1902, to determine whether or not a special tax of 20 cents shall be levied in said School District on each one hundred dollars worth of property for the purpose of supplementing the free school fund as appropriated to said School District.

It is further ordered that Jim Bennett be and he is hereby appointed presiding officer of said Election.

In the Matter of New School District and Boundary May 17, 1902
This day came

considered the creation
of a new School District and it appearing
to the Court that for the convenience of
the public free school the School District
No. 7 is too large and the distance some
children are compelled to go in order
to reach their school is too far the
Court is of the opinion that there should
be created a new district, dividing
said School Dist. No. 7.

It is therefore ordered by the court
that a new School District be and
the same is cut off of the Monticello School
District No. 7 and created a New School
district. The name and number of said
New District shall be Liberty School

District No. 4. and the boundary line between said Dist. No. 4 and Dist. No. 7 shall be as follows:

Beginning at N.E. corner of B. Hicklin Survey of land Thence West with N.B. line of Liberty School District No. 7.
