

Be it remembered that on this the 16<sup>th</sup> day of September A.D. 1902 the Hon. Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas. Be convened in special session for the purpose of opening the polls and counting the vote of an election held in Titus County on the 5<sup>th</sup> of Sept. 1902 for the purpose of determining whether or not Intoxicating liquors shall be sold within the limits or boundaries of said Titus County; present and presiding the Hon. P.H. Rogers County Judge and in attendance W.J. Delapied, H.C. Thomas, W.W. Kring, and local Titus County Commissioners of Titus County Texas, Sam Parker Sheriff and Orville Clark of said court. Whereupon the following proceedings were had to wit:

The State of Texas. Be it remembered that County of Titus on this the 16<sup>th</sup> day of September A.D. 1902 a special session of the County Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas. held for the purpose of after opening the polls and counting the vote of an election held in and for the County of Titus State of Texas on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of September 1902 to determine whether or not the sale of intoxicating liquors shall be prohibited in said County. And said Court proceeded to open the polls and count the votes cast at said election and it appearing to the Court that at said election twelve hundred and twenty seven (1227) votes were cast for prohibition and that nine hundred and fifty four (954) votes were cast against prohibition, and that there were at said election two hundred and seventy three (273) votes more cast for prohibition than there were cast against prohibition. It is therefore hereby ordered and declared that said election resulted in favor of

Prohibition. And it is ordered by the County Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas that the sale of Intoxicating Liquors be and the same is hereby absolutely prohibited within the limits of Titus County Texas, except as for the purposes and under the regulations prescribed by law, until such time as the qualified voters of said County may at a legal election held for that purpose, by a majority vote declare otherwise.

 held in Titus County Texas on Sept 5<sup>th</sup> 1902  
 and prohibiting the sale of Intoxicating  
 Liquors in Titus County Texas, be published  
 in the Times Review, a News paper pub-  
 lished in said County, for four successive  
 weeks.

 Court that the Treasurer  
 be allowed and directed to transfer  
 \$300<sup>00</sup> from the Court House & Jail fund  
 to the General County fund.

In the Matter of Retencion 3 Sept 16. 1902  
 Court and Sheriff 3 This day it is  
 ordered  
 by the Court  
 that P.H. Rogers, W.J. Delapield, H.C. Thomas  
 W.M. King and Lebbe Russell each be  
 allowed 3 dollars for one day services  
 in this term of Court and that same  
 Porter & Sheriff be allowed 2 dollars  
 for one day waiting on Court

There being no further business before  
the Court it is ordered that Court  
do now adjourn.
