

Be it remembered that on this the ninth day of February AD 1903, there was begun and helden a regular term of the honorable Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas at the Court house thereof in the town of M'Pleasant Texas. Present and presiding the Hon. P. H. Rogers County Judge of Titus County Texas. Also F. Hays, G. M. Scott, W. M. King, and J. S. Sutherland, County Commissioners in and for said County and in attendance Sam Parker Sheriff and Constable County Clerk. Whereupon the following proceeding were had to-mit:

In the Matter of Petition of L.C. Branch et al for a Public highway

This day came on to be examined the petition of L.C. Branch and others for a public highway, and it appearing to the court that said petition is in due form and properly verified by affidavits of 10 of the freeholders of Titus County, on January 28, 1903. It is therefore ordered by the Court that said petition be and the same is hereby granted and the road as described in said petition is hereby declared a public highway as follows to-wit: Beginning at a point on the M'Pleasant & Clarksville public road about 6¹/₂ miles North from M'Pleasant Texas. Thence West, on the land line between Thos. McPeter and E. Spencer, said being Original Survey, now owned by L.C. Branch & W. A. Baxley, a distance of 300 yards to the land line between L.C. Branch and Luther Allen. Thence due West, on said line about 200 yards.

It is further ordered that said road be opened up by the owners of the land for a space of 15 feet on each side of said line and left open for the general public.

be heard the report of
A.B. Lewellen, W.J. White, A.C. Barrett, J.P. Kearne and
J.B. Roberts, a jury of view appointed by this Court
as the November Term of this Court to try and
the road herein before described. And it
appearing to the Court that said Jury of View
has complied with the law in giving the
notices and assessing the damages and
taking the oath; And that said report
is in due form. It is therefore ordered
by the Court that said report be and
the same is in all things approved and
ordered recorded upon the minutes of
this Court. And it further appearing
to the Court that said Jury of View has
assessed the damages as required by law
and that all the freeholders affected by
said road have waived damages except
H.T. Kirkwick. And they assess his damages
at Fifty Dollars. It is therefore ordered
by the Court that all the freeholders
affected by said road, take nothing
by this action except H.T. Kirkwick
and that he the said H.T. Kirkwick have
and recover of and from Tipton County
the said sum of Fifty Dollars as
assessed by said Jury of View. And
said amount is hereby set aside out
of the Road and bridge fund of said County
to the credit of said H.T. Kirkwick. And the
Clerk will issue warrant to cover same.

In the Matter of the report of Dr. John P. 1903

applying to the same after due consideration I
said upon that the road, as described in
said report is of sufficient public importance

having the said job are kept closer

to open up said road for a space of 20 feet
on each side of the lines therein mentioned
and clear out the right of way as required
by law. It is further ordered that he
have the following named hands to work
said road to - said: Jessie Barnett, Dave Roper
Jesse Roberts, Silas Roberts Albert Roberts, L.
Roberts, Jim Dubose John Heame & Paul Roper
with authority to summon any and all
other persons not designated herein and
known to him to be liable to work on the
public roads in said precinct.
It is further ordered that this road shall
be road precinct No. 81.

W.W. Pleasant Texas January 14, 1903

To the Honorable Commissioners Court of Titus
County Texas,

We the undersigned a jury of men appoin-
ted at the November term of your Honorable
Court to lay out a road in pursuance with
the Commission issued herein, after taking
the oath prescribed by law did lay out said
road and beg beg leave to make the
following report:

We have laid out the said road as follows:
Beginning 400 yards beyond the bridge on Tanders-
ley's creek from W.W. Pleasant at the point
where the neighborhood road leaves the
W.W. Pleasant and Monticello road Thence
up by the residence of G.T. Kirkpatrick and
an up to the corner of a 25 acre tract now
owned by A.T. Kirkpatrick a distance of 722 yards
Thence an west with the land lines between
A.T. Kirkpatrick and R.B. Lewellen past
the residence of R.B. Lewellen and an to the
land line of J.B. Roberts and an through
the land of J.P. Roberts past his residence
to the land line of W.W. & John Dubose.
Thence North to Dubose's corner Thence
West on the land line of the said Dubose
and John Heame to the land of W.J. White

Thence on West to a tenant house of the said White. Then North East to the land lines of John Kearne and Tom Barrett. Then an East to the corner of John Kearne's and on down the land line of Al Redfearn and Tom Barrett crossing the St Louis R.R. at a new crossing and an North W. and terminating at Farmers Academy.

We also beg leave to report that we notified the owners of the land affected by this road and all save one have waived any damages incident to the opening thereof. The said waiver is in writing and attached hereto. As to the other Mr. G.F. Kirkpatrick after giving him five days notice written notice, that the damages incident to said road would be assessed on the 13th day of January, 1903. We met and assessed his damages at \$50⁰⁰. At the same time the said G.F. Kirkpatrick also appeared and filed a written statement which we also hereto attach, asking for \$100⁰⁰ damages. This item being the only one incident to the opening up of said road. We therefore recommend that this honorable court allow the said G.F. Kirkpatrick the said sum of \$50⁰⁰ that it be set apart to him by special order, that the said road be ordered opened up, that an overseer be appointed over the same and that hands be apportioned to work the said road.

matter of Taxation And it appearing
to the court that the reduction of 5cts
on the taxation of year 1902 created
a deficit in the Treasury. It is
therefore Considered and ordered by
the Court. That the following tax
be levied and collected for year
A.D. 1903 on all property subject to
an advalorem tax in this County Texan
except that which is exempted under
the Constitution and laws of Texan.
to-wit:

For General County purposes there shall
be levied and collected Twenty five (25)
Cents on the One hundred dollars worth of property;

For Court house and jail purposes
there shall be levied and collected
Twelve (12) Cents on the one hundred dollars
worth of property; And to create a
sinking fund to pay off Court house
bonds and the interest thereon there shall

be levied and collected Thirteen (13) cents on the One hundred dollars worth of property. For Road and Bridge purposes there shall be levied and collected Eleven (11) cents on the One hundred dollars worth of property; and to create a sinking fund to pay off the Road and Bridge bonds and the interest thereon, there shall be levied and collected Four (4) cents on the One hundred dollars worth of property.

There shall be levied and collected an occupation tax of One half the state occupation tax, on all occupations subject to occupation tax under the laws of Texas, and a poll tax of Twenty five cents per capita on all persons subject to pay poll tax under the laws of Texas.

There shall be levied and collected in School District No. one, Twenty cents on the One hundred dollars worth of property.

There shall be levied and collected in School District No. 2, Fifteen Cents on the One hundred dollars worth of property.

There shall be levied and collected in School District No. three, Twenty Cents on the One hundred dollars worth of property.

There shall be levied and collected in School District No. six, Twenty Cents on the One hundred dollars worth of property.

There shall be levied and collected in School District No. seven, Twenty Cents on the One hundred dollars worth of property.

There shall be levied and collected in School District No. 8, Twenty Cents on the one hundred dollars worth of property.

There shall be levied and collected in School District No. Thirty Three Twenty Cents on the one hundred dollars worth of property.
