H. H. Rogers County Judge and in addition Messrs. T. Hay, H. M. Scott, W. M. King and J. S. Sanderson being Commissioners Sam Porter Sheriff and Garza County Clerk, whereupon the following proceedings among others were had, to-wit:-

In the matter of the Report of H. T. Rhea et al; This day came on a Jury of View to be examined the Report of H. T. Rhea et al. A Jury of View appointed by the Court to lay out and establish a public Road beginning at the terminal of the Cookville road near H. T. Rhea, and ending at the McPherson and Cass Road, and it appearing to the Court that the said Jury has laid out said road in accordance with law and there is no damages assessed as against the County by reason of said road It is therefore ordered by the Court that said road report be and the same is in all things approved and ordered recorded for a better description of said road and said road as described in said Jury report is herewith declared a public second class road. It is further ordered by the Court that the said jurors each be allowed the sum of two dollars for their days work in laying and said road and being will issue for said fees. It is further ordered that J. M. Hill be allowed to change said road and put it in his E. B. line provided he puts the new change in good condition.

In the Matter of Paupers 3 July 80-1903
 John Thompson 3 This day came on
 to be considered the
 application of A. P. Barker to have John
 Thompson put upon the Paupers list
 of this County. And it being made to
 appear to the Court that said John Thompson
 is not able by manual labor to earn
 support for himself because of a very
 bad cancer on his face and neck
 and that he is in a very precarious
 condition. It is therefore considered
 and ordered by the Court that
 said John Thompson be and he is
 herein put upon the County Pauper
 list and is allowed Seven and 50/100
 dollars monthly for his support and
 the Clerk will issue monthly a voucher
 on the General County fund to cover
 same in favor of John Thompson.

In the Matter of the 3 August 10-1903
 Resignation of 3 This day came on
 W. B. Taylor Constable 3 to be heard the Resig-
 nation of W. B. Taylor
 as Constable for Precinct No. 6, Titus Co. Texas
 and it appearing to the Court that said
 Taylor is going to leave the present
 wherein he was elected Constable.
 It is therefore ordered that said resignation
 be and the same is accepted.

In the Matter of Appointing 3 August 10-1903
 Constable for Precinct No. 6, 3 This day came on
 Titus County Texas to be considered
 the appointment of
 a constable for Precinct No. 6, Titus Co. Texas
 to fill the unexpired term of W. B. Taylor
 and occasioned by the resignation of the
 said W. B. Taylor. And the Court

after considering all applicants is of the opinion that J.D. Taylor should be appointed & is therefore ordered by the Court that J.D. Taylor, he and he is hereby appointed Constable of Precinct number six in and for Titus County Tex. and that he be required to give bond in the sum of five hundred dollars and take the oath prescribed by the Constitution.

 G.N. Clark's E.B. line 750 yards to Bob

 said Narramore land 550 yards to to

 across Smith land 614 yards to S.C.

 County Jail. And it is considered
 and ordered by the court that the sum
 of two dollars (\$10^c) be set aside and
 paid monthly to any person who
 will take said inmate and keep
 her until there is room in the Asylum.
 Said parties are required to give bond
 for her safe keeping and detention
 as is required by law.

And coming on further to be considered the advisability of creating a Voting District at Winfield the Court is of the opinion that same would be a great advantage to the general public, and more convenient for the people in and around Winfield. It is therefore ordered by the Court that the following boundary lines be and they are hereby declared and established boundary lines of Voting Precinct No. 11. at Winfield Texas here now established to-wit: Beginning at the North East corner of Voting Precinct No. Six in the W.B. line of Voting Precinct No. One. on the W.M.Pleasant and Sulphur Springs road, Thence North with W.B. line of Precinct No. One to the W.M.Pleasant and W.M.Vernon road, thence in a westerly direction with said W.M.Pleasant & W.M.Vernon road to the Franklin County line. Thence South with said line to the W.M.Pleasant and Sulphur Springs road. Thence with said W.M.Pleasant and Sulphur Springs road in easterly direction to the beginning.

It is further ordered by the court that all elections in said precinct shall be held at Winfield.
