

The State of Texas, T. M. Pearson, Texas, Sept 30th 1904
 Titus County, Whereas, an election was duly
 held in the town or village of
 Cookville on the 6th day of September 1904, to determine
 whether the territory after described territory
 should be incorporated for fire school purposes only,
 and returns of said election duly made, and there-
 fore fearing from said returns that there were cast at
 said election 56 votes for "Corporation" and 18 votes
 for "Male corporation" it is therefore adjudged that
 said election resulted in favor of said incorporation.
 Therefore, I, P. G. Rogers, County Judge of Titus County,
 Texas, do hereby declare the inhabitants of said
 territory herein after described as duly incorporated
 for fire school purposes only, said incorporation
 to be named the Cookville Independent School Dis-
 trict. The said Independent School District con-
 tains a population of 200 inhabitants, and the terri-
 tory so incorporated is described by metes and bounds
 as follows. Beginning at a stake in the T. H. and Morris
 lots, line where said line crosses the N. W. line of a
 201 1/4 acre tract of land out of the J. A. Lang
 Survey, said tract owned by M. A. Wright, thence
 west with the N. W. line of said Wright tract 800 rods,
 a stake in the E. N. line of the J. M. Becker Survey.
 Thence north with the said E. N. line of the said Becker
 tract survey 1000 rods to the N. E. corner of the same, a
 stake in the S. E. line of the W. D. Smith survey -
 thence west with the said S. E. line of the said Becker
 survey 735 rods to the N. W. corner of the same. thence
 south with the N. W. line of the said Becker Survey
 500 rods to the L. corner of the same, the S. E. corner
 of the N. W. Taylor Survey. thence west with the S. E.
 line of the said N. W. Taylor Survey 1344 rods to the
 S. W. corner of the same, a place in the S. W. line of the
 S. W. King Survey. thence north with the S. W. line of
 the King Survey 600 rods to the N. E. corner of the same -
 thence west with the N. W. line of the King Survey past
 the N. W. corner of the same. thence south with the
 N. W. line of the Bellapais Survey 1870 rods. thence
 L. corner, a place in S. McGehee's S. W. line.
 thence north with the E. W. line of the Bellapais
 Survey 300 rods. to the N. E. corner of the same

Thence West 700 mra. with the N.W. line of the
 Gillespie survey to the N.W. corner of the same -
 Thence south with the N.W. line of the Gillespie
 Survey 620 mra. a stake in the N.E. corner of the
 J. M. Daugherty survey 520 mra. his S.W. corner -
 Then East with the S.E. corner of the Thorntree side survey
 Thence west with the S.W. line of the Foothills
 Survey 1594 mra. the N.W. corner of the W.C. Battle
 Survey - Thence south with the S.W. line of the
 Battle 13xx mra. his S.W. corner. Thence West with
 the N.W. line of the said Payor survey 1124 mra. his
 N.W. corner. Thence south with the N.W. line of the
 said Payor survey 1344 mra. his S.W. corner. —
 Thence East with the S.E. line of the said Payor survey
 411 mra. N. P. Sullivan N.W. corner. Thence with Sullivan's
 N.W. line 121 mra. his extreme S.E. corner. Thence south
 with the E.W. line of a small survey in the name of
 W. G. Wilson 240 mra. his S.E. corner. Thence west
 with the said Wilson's E.W. line and the N.W. line
 of the Rock Bank survey past Wilson's S.W. corner
 532 mra. in all a stake on the N.W. line of the same -
 being the N.W. corner of a tract of land more owned by S. C.
 Dab and known as the "Red place". Thence south with
 the division line between the said Red place and
 a tract out of the said survey known as the "Jack
 Moon place" 134 x mra. a stake in the S.W. line of the
 S.W. line of the said Burn survey 260 mra. west of the
 N.E. corner of the G. W. Shuck survey. Thence East with
 the S.W. line of the Burn survey 260 mra. the N.E. corner
 of the G. W. Shuck survey, a stake. Thence South
 with the S.E. line 9567 mra. a stake in said line -
 the S.W. corner of the E. C. Beasley survey. Thence
 East with the S.W. line of the Beasley survey past
 the S.E. corner of the same it being the S.W. corner
 of the Da Keith survey 2697 mra. a stake in the S.W.
 line of the O. Keith survey, at the N.W. corner of a tract
 of land once owned by Lawson Johnson. Thence South
 with the division line between the said Lawson
 Johnson tract and tract once known as the said
 Yaney tract more owned by T. H. Fizzell, and
 on south with the N.W. line of the J. E. Johnson
 tract, John P. Denney tract and J. H. Brown tract all
 out of the G. A. Blapton survey 2080 mra. in all

Said J. W. Brown's S.W. corner. Thence East with Brown's S.W. line 1500 ft. to his S.E. corner the N.W. corner of a tract owned by J. R. Homer. Thence south with the N.W. line of the said Homer tract and the N.W. line of another tract of land owned by the said J. W. Brown 930 ft. to Brown's S.W. corner. Thence East with Brown's S.E. line 1380 ft. to Brown's S.E. corner and J. E. Johnson's N.E. corner. Thence south with Johnson's S.W. line and J. D. Southland's S.T. line 443 ft. to Southland's S.W. corner. Thence East with Southland's S.W. line his S.E. corner and on with the S.W. line of the A. C. Galoupe tract past his S.E. corner and on with Tom Davis' tract 2150 ft. to all Davis' S.E. corner. Thence north with Davis' S.W. line past his N.S. corner and on with Lee Smith's S.E. line 1760 ft. to all Smith's N.E. corner a stake on the bank of Boggy Creek. Thence East with the S.W. line of a tract of land owned by J. F. Martin and known as the John Davis place 800 ft. to a stake on the Old and Morris Co. line. Thence North with the said County line 2810 ft. to the N.W. line of the N.Y. State Survey and at 1800 ft. farther on Mr. McDonald's N.W. line, and at 1344 7/8 ft. farther on Junia Land's N.W. line and at 1310 4/16 ft. farther on or 926 7/8 ft. the place of beginning.
