Hanes et. al. for an election in School District No. 6, (Oak Grove) to enable the qualified tax paying voters of said school district to determine whether or not a tax of 40 cents on the One Hundred Dollars shall be levied in said school district for school purposes. And it appearing to the court that said petition is in due form and signed by the requisite number of qualified property tax paying voters of said school district it is therefore ordered by the court that an election be held on the 23rd day of Sept. 1905; for said purpose, at Oak Grove School House, in said district.

It is further ordered by the court that W. Reid, W. H. Richardson, and T. D. Glass, be appointed managers of said election, and they are hereby appointed.

 H. C. Smith and others for public road. { This day came on to be  
 heard the petition of H. C.  
 Smith and 36 others for a public road from Agg  
 to white oak creek, and it appearing to the Court that  
 said proposed public road is necessary for the convenience  
 of the public travel, it is therefore ordered by the court  
 that said petition be, and the same is hereby granted.

 in the County of Bexar and State of Texas, thence due North

 Mrs. Embry and Mrs. Louis Ferrell to Mrs. Louis Ferrell's N. W.  
 corner, thence East with Mrs. Ferrell's and Henry Bell's land  
 lines to Sam Johnson's residence. Thence North with the  
 West Boundary line of Sam Johnson's and Henry Bell's  
 East boundary line. Thence North with Mrs. Will's Parsons  
 West line and W. Edwards East line, George Capathers East  
 line, C. P. Dugger's West line, George Smith's West line, Willard  
 and Tom Cameron's East boundary lines to White Oak  
 creek. It is further ordered by the Court that the road  
 Superintendent of Bexar County, Texas, be and he is hereby  
 authorized to open and keep repaired said road for  
 the convenience of the public travel.
