 I heard the petition of G. S. Names et. al. for an election in School District No. 10, (Oak Grove) to enable the qualified tax paying voters of said School District to determine whether or not a tax of 20 cents on the One Hundred Dollars shall be levied in said School District for school purposes. And it appearing to the court that said petition is in due form and signed by the requisite number of qualified property tax-paying voters of said School District, it is therefore ordered by the court that an election be held on the 23rd day of Sept. 1905, for said purpose, at Oak Grove School House, in said District.
 It is further ordered by the court that A. Reid, W. H. Blackard, and R. D. Glass, be appointed managers of said election, and they are hereby appointed.

 lines to Hans Johnson's residence. Thence North with the
 West boundary line of Hans Johnson's and Henry Bell's
 East boundary line. Thence North with Mrs. Miller's Parsons
 West line and G. W. Edwards' East line, Cass Crabtree's East
 line, B. P. Diggins' West line, Jess Smith's West line, Willard
 and Tom Cameron's East boundary lines to White Oak
 creek. It is further ordered by the Court that the Road
 Superintendent of Dittus County, Texas, be and he is hereby
 authorized to open and keep repaired said road for
 the convenience of the public travel.

No. 769 In the Matter of setting the time for holding the terms of the County Court } August 14th. 1905.
 } This day came on to be considered the time for holding the County Court of Titus County, Texas, for the purpose of disposing of the Criminal, Civil, and Probate business of said County, and it appearing to the court that the 1st Monday in September, the 1st Monday in December, the 1st Monday in March, and the 1st Monday in June will be for the convenience of the county, and also more advantageous to the county for the Court to convene, it is therefore ordered by the Court that the time for holding County Court for the purpose of disposing of Criminal, Civil and Probate business be fixed for the 1st Monday in March, the 1st Monday in June, the 1st Monday in September and the 1st Monday in December of each year.
