and hereafter known as Lone Star School
District No. 29 Titus county Texas by the com-
missioners court of said County prior to the
burning of the court house, petition you to

said district were destroyed with the court
house of said County, did, write and bounds

We your petitioners respectfully represent that the subscribers herof constitute at least 25% of the Legally qualified tax paying citizens of a common county school district No. 29 of said county and that at least 20 of the subscribers are qualified property tax paying voters of said district we pray that an election be ordered to be held in said district to determine whether or not a two-thirds majority of the Legally qualified property tax paying voters of said district desire the issuance of bonds on the faith and credit of the said common school district to provide funds to expend in payment of accounts legally contracted in building and equipping school house for said common school district and to determine whether or not the commissioners court of said county shall be authorized to levy assess and collect annually while said bonds or any of them are outstanding a tax upon all taxable property within said district of and at the rate of 15¢ on each \$100.00 valuation thereof to provide for the payment of the interest of said bonds as it accrues and the creation of a sinking fund sufficient to discharge said bonds at maturity. the following report of the counties of Titus and Morris. To the Hon. Commissioners court of Titus County Texas, I C. M. Embry ^{tax assessor} of Titus County, respectfully represent that I have carefully examined the latest approved tax rolls of said county to ascertain the amount of taxable property of common county line school district No. 29 of said county that I find and so certify that according to the tax rolls of said County for the year 1905 which are the latest approved rolls of the county. To the Hon. Commissioners court of Titus County Texas: I H. D. Russell Tax assessor of Morris County Texas. Respectfully represent that I have carefully examined the latest approved tax rolls of said county to ascertain the amount of taxable property of common school district No. 29 of Titus County said district lying partly in Morris County that I find and so certify that according to the tax rolls of Morris County for the year 1905 which are the latest rolls of the county the total assessed valuation of real property situated and personal property owned in said district in Morris County is as follows.

Dated the 14th April 1906. Respectfully submitted H. D. Russell Tax assessor, Morris County Texas, and the said petition and report and the evidence in support thereof having been considered by the court, the court is of the opinion and so finds: First that said petition is signed by at least 25% of the legally qualified

tax paying citizens of common school district No. 26 of this County and that not less than 2% of the subscribers to said petition are qualified property tax paying voters of said district. Second that the total assessed valuation of taxable property within said district according to the latest approved tax rolls of the counties of Litter and Morris being the rolls for the year 1905 is \$33,759.00. Third that the proposed tax of 15¢ upon said valuation will provide for an annual interest on and the necessary sinking fund to discharge at maturity bonds to the amount of \$500.00 running 20 years and bearing 5% interest and that said proposed tax will not exceed 20¢ on the \$100 valuation.

Fourth that a necessity exists for the issuance of bonds to the amount of \$500.00 for the purpose of building and equipping school house for said district and that it is lawful and necessary to order the election petitioned for. It is therefore ordered by the court that an election be held on the 12th day of May 1906, at a house 300 yds North of the School lot in common school district No. 26 of this County (as established by order of this court of the date the 14th day of April 1906 which is recorded in book 2 pages 245, 246, 247 of the minutes of this court) to determine whether or not a two-thirds majority of the legally qualified tax paying voters of that district desire the issuance of bonds on the faith and credit of common school district in the amount of \$500 running 20 years and bearing 5% interest for a sum for the purpose of providing funds to be expended in the payment of accounts legally contracted in building and equipping school house for said common school district and to determine also whether or not the commissioners court of this county shall be authorized levy, assess and collect ad valorem while said bonds or any of them are outstanding a tax upon all taxable property within said District of and at the rate of 15¢ on each \$100 valuation thereof to provide

for the payment of interest on said bonds as it accrues and the creation of a sinking fund sufficient to discharge said bonds at maturity. J.B. Philipe is hereby appointed officer for said election and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same and he shall within five days after said election has been held make due return thereof to this court as it is required by law. For holding a general election the ballot for said election shall have printed thereon the following: "For school tax" "Against school tax" "For against issuing \$500⁰⁰ school house bonds running 20 years for common school district No 29 Titus County Texas all persons who are legally qualified voters of this County and who are recipient property tax payers in said district as shown by the last assessment rolls of the County shall be entitled to vote at said election the sheriff of this county shall give notice of said election by posting three notices in said district for the three weeks before the election.

State of Texas Whereas on the 14th day of April County of Titus 1906 a petition was presented me for an election in common school district No 29 of this County on the question of issuing bonds for building and equipping school house for said district and the levying of a tax of 15¢ on the \$100.00 valuation of property of said district for said bonds said petition bearing the requisite number of signatures and being in every respect in conformity with the law and whereas the said petition having also on the 14th day of April 1906 been presented to the commissioners' court of this county said court upon consideration thereof found it lawful and necessary to order an election petitioned for and determined that it was necessary to issue such bonds to the amount of \$500⁰⁰ running 20 years and bearing 5% interest. Now therefore I set G. Caldwell in my capacity as County Judge of Titus County Texas do hereby

order that an election be held on the 12th day of May 1906 at a house 300 yds North of school house lot in said common school house district No. 29 of this County (as established by this court on the 14th day of May 1906 which is recorded in book 21 Commissioners Court Minutes) page 245, 246, 247,) to determine whether or not a two-thirds majority of the legally qualified tax paying voters of that district desire the issuance of bonds on the face and credit of common school district in the amount of \$500⁰⁰ running 20 years and bearing 5% interest per annum for the purpose of providing funds to be expended in payment of accounts legally contracted in building and equipping school house for said common school district and to determine also whether or not the commissioners court of this ^{County} shall be authorized to levy assess and collect annually while said bonds or any of them are outstanding a tax upon all taxable property within said district of and at the rate of 16¢ on each \$100⁰⁰ valuation thereof to provide for the payment of the interest on said bonds as it accrues and a creation of a sinking fund sufficient to discharge said bonds at maturity H. P. Philips is appointed hereby appointed special officer for said election and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same and he shall make due returns to the commissioners court of Titus County within 5 days after said election has been held as required by law for holding a general election. The ballots for said election shall have printed thereon the following "For School Tax" - "Against School Tax". For or against the issuing \$500⁰⁰ school house bonds running 20 years for common school district number 29 All persons who are legal qualified voters of this state and of this county and who are resident property tax payers in said district as shown by the last assessment roll of the county shall be entitled to vote at said election. The sheriff of this County shall give notice of said election by posting 3 notices in said dis-

trict for 3 weeks before the election. This order
