

To the commissioners court of Titus county, State of Texas, we the under signed residents citizens of the following described territory lying in the Counties of Titus and Morris and hereafter known as Lone Star School District No. 29 Titus county Texas by the commissioners court of said county prior to the burning of the court house, petition you to establish the following as the meter and bounds of said district, as all the records of said district were destroyed with the court house of said county, said meter and bounds being as near as could be practically ascertained the same as the former. Beginning at the S.W. corner of S.M. Saughy survey; Thence East with S. line of said survey 62500 to a corner in N. line of T.G. Gilipie survey, thence South with said line 7. 65000 to the S.W. corner of said survey, thence East with S. line of said survey 13750000 to the S.E. corner of same, thence North 50000 with E. line of said Gilipie to a corner in S. line of the S.M. Saughy survey, thence East with said S. line 5000000 to S.E. corner in the N. line of W.B. Taylor survey, thence South with said N. line 10000000 to S.W. corner of said survey, thence East with S. line of same 13440000 to S.E. corner of W.B. We your petitioners respectfully represent that the subscribers herof constitute at least 25% of the legally qualified tax paying citizens of a common county county school district No. 29 of said county and that at least 20 of the subscribers are qualified property tax paying voters of said district we pray that an election be ordered to be held in said district to determine whether or not a two-thirds majority of the legally qualified property tax paying voters of said district desire the issuance of bonds on the faith and credit of the said common school district to provide funds to expended in payments of accounts legally contracted in building and equipping school house for said common school district, and to determine whether or not the commissioners court of said county shall be authorized to levy assess and collect annually while said bonds or any of them are outstanding a tax upon all taxable property within said district of and at the rate of 15¢ on each \$100.00 valuation thereof to provide for the payment of the interest of said bonds as it accrues and the creation of a sinking fund sufficient to discharge said bonds at maturity, Dated this 10th day of April 1906, L. To the Hon. Commissioners court of Titus County Texas: I H. D. Russell Tax Assessor of Morris County Texas. Respectfully represent that I have carefully examined the latest approved tax rolls of said county to ascertain the amount of taxable property of common school district No. 29 of Titus County said district lying partly in Morris County that I find and so certify that according to the tax rolls of Morris County for the year 1905 which are the latest rolls of the county the total assessed valuation of real property situated and personal property owned in said district in Morris County is as follows:

Russell Tax assessor, Morris County Texas, and the said petition and reports and the evidence in support thereof having been considered by the court, the court is of the opinion and so finds: First that said petition is signed by at least 25% of the legally qualified

tax paying citizens of common school district No. 26 of this County and that not less than 20 of the subscribers to said petition are qualified property tax paying voters of said district. Second that the total assessed valuation of taxable property within said district according to the latest approved tax rolls of the counties of Titus and Morris (being the rolls for the year 1905) is \$33759.00. Third that the proposed tax of 15¢ upon said valuation will provide for an annual interest on and the necessary sinking fund to discharge at maturity bonds to the amount of \$5000 running 20 yrs and bearing 5% interest and that said proposed tax will not exceed 20¢ on the \$100<sup>00</sup> valuation. Fourth that a necessity exists for the issuance of bonds to the amount of \$500<sup>00</sup> for the purpose of building and equipping school house for said district and that it is lawful and necessary to order the election petitioned for. It is therefore ordered by the court that an election be held on the 12th day of May 1906, at a house 300 yds north of the school lot in common school district No. 29 of this County (as established by order of this court of the date the 14th day of April 1906 which is recorded in book 2 pages 245, 246, 247 of the minutes of this court) to determine whether or not a two-thirds majority of the legally qualified tax paying voters of that district desire the issuance of bonds on the faith and credit of common school district in the amount of \$500<sup>00</sup> running 20 years and bearing 5% interest per annum for the purpose of providing funds to be expended in the payments of accounts legally contracted in building and equipping school house for said common school district and to determine also whether or not the commissioners court of this county shall be authorized levy, assess and collect annually while said bonds or any of them are outstanding a tax upon all taxable property within said district of and at the rate of 15¢ on each \$100<sup>00</sup> valuation thereof to provide



order that an election be held on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of May 1906 at a house 300 yds North of school house lot in said common school house district No. 29 of this County (as established by the court on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of May 1906 which is recorded in book 21 Commissioners Court Minutes, pages 245, 246, 247) to determine whether or not a two-thirds majority of the legally qualified tax paying voters of that district desire the issuance of bonds on the face and credit of common school district in the amount of \$500<sup>00</sup> running 20 years and bearing 5% interest per annum for the purpose of providing funds to be expended in payment of accounts legally contracted in building and equipping school house for said common school district and to determine also whether or not the commissioners court of this <sup>County</sup> shall be authorized to levy assess and collect annually while said bonds or any of them are out standing a tax upon all taxable property within said district of and at the rate of 16¢ on each \$100<sup>00</sup> valuation thereof to provide for the payment of the interest on said bonds as it accrues and a creation of a sinking fund sufficient to discharge said bonds at maturity J. B. Philife is appointed hereby appointed precinct officer for said election and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same and he shall make due returns to the commissioners court of Titus County within 5 days after said election has been held as required by law for holding a general election. The ballots for said election shall have printed thereon the following "For School Tax" - "Against School Tax."

"For or against issuing \$500<sup>00</sup> school house bonds running 20 years for common school district number 29" All persons who are legal qualified voters of this state and of this County and who are resident property tax payers in said district as shown by the last assessment roll of the county shall be entitled to vote at said election. The sheriff of this County shall give notice of said election by posting 3 notices in said dis-

tried for 3 weeks before the election. This order made this the 14th day of April 1906.
