Woods et al for changing the voting box from Marshall Spigg to J. H. Woods store at Reply, came before the Court, and after due consideration the same was granted.

In the matter of the School Election in School District no. 29, Tilton Co, Tex. May 14 1906, on this day the Court proceeded to canvass the returns and declare the results of the election in District No 29, in Tilton Co, Tex to levy 16<sup>00</sup> on the \$100<sup>00</sup> valuation.

of property in said school district No 29, on this day came on to be heard considered the returns of an election held on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of May 1906 in common school district No. 29 of Titus County upon the question of issuing \$500<sup>00</sup> of school house bonds for said district running 20 years and bearing 5% interest and levying a tax of 15¢ on the \$10000 valuation of taxable property of said district for said bonds and it appearing that said election was in all respects legally held and that said returns were duly and legally made and that there was cast at said election 28 votes of which number there cast for school tax 16 votes, against school tax 7 votes. For issuing \$500<sup>00</sup> school house bonds running 20 years for common school district No 29, Titus County Texas 16 votes, against issuing \$500<sup>00</sup> school house bonds running 20 years for common school district No 29, Titus County Texas 7 votes. And it appearing to the court from said returns that 7/8 of the qualified property tax paying voters of said district voting at said election voted for said tax and that a 2/3 majority of the votes cast at said election were cast in favor of issuing said bonds the court does hereby declare the said tax to have carried in said district and the proposition for the issuance of said bonds to have been adopted and that this court is authorized to issue said bonds and to levy and have assessed and collected said tax.

On 14<sup>th</sup> day of May 1906.  
The commissioners Court of Titus County convened in regular session at a regular term of said court all the members thereof to wit Geo. F. Hays, Commissioner of pre. No. 1 Geo. F. Smith commissioner of prect No. 2 and J. C. Smith commissioner of prect No. 3 and S. F. Baldwin County Judge being present and among other proceedings had passed the following order whereas at an election held for the purpose on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of May 1906. a two thirds majority of the qualified property tax paying voters of common school district No. 29 of this County voting at said election voted in favor of the issuance of the bonds hereinafter described and in

favor of the tax hereinafter levied it is therefore ordered by the commissioners court of Titus of said county to be called common school district No. 29 school house bonds be issued on the faith and credit of common school district No. 29 as reestablished by the order of commissioners court of said county passed on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of April 1906. which is of record in the minutes of the said court on pages 245, 246 and 247 of book 2. for the purpose of providing funds to expended in payment of accounts legally contracted in building and equipping school houses for said common school district. Said bonds shall be numbered consecutively from 1 to 5 inclusive shall be of the denomination of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars each aggregating five hundred \$500.00 dollars. They shall be dated May 14<sup>th</sup> 1906 and shall become due and payable 20 years after date. But may be redeemed at the pleasure of the district, at any time after fifteen years from their date. They shall bear interest at the rate of 5% per cent per annum payable at Mt Pleasant Texas annually on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of April of each year. principal and interest shall be payable upon presentation and surrender of bonds or proper coupons in lawful money of the United States at Mt Pleasant Texas in Titus County. The said bonds shall be signed by the county judge countersigned by the County clerk and registered by the county Treasurer and the seal of the commissioners court shall be impressed upon each of them. Fac simile signatures of the county judge and County clerk may be lithographed engraved or printed on the coupons. It is further ordered by the court that to pay interest on said bonds and create a sinking fund sufficient to discharge them at maturity a tax of and at the rate of 15¢ on each \$10000 of the assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation in said common school district No. 29 of this county shall be annually levied assessed and collected upon said property until said bonds with interest are paid and said tax is here now levied for the year 1906 and for each year thereafter while said bonds or any of them are outstanding and it shall be assessed and

collected for the year 1906 and each year thereafter and applied to the purpose named.
