

Be it remembered that on Aug 15th 1906, at a regular term of the Com. Court, there was present and presiding, Sub. J. Caldwell, Co. Judge, Geo. A. Hays, Com. Prec. No. 1, Sub. P. Smith Com. Prec. No. 2, Mack King Com. Prec. No. 3, and J. J. Smith Com. Prec. No. 4, Sam Porter Sheriff, and W. M. Brown Clerk,

among other things the following order was passed.

Whereas, on April 14 1906, the Com. Court of this County, passed an order which is of record, on pages 246-46-47, of Book 2, of the minutes of said Court, defining and declaring the boundaries of common school district No. 29, Titus Co. Texas, which is a county line district embracing territory lying partly in Titus and partly in marine counties, which was established by the Com. Court of this County prior to the distribution by fire in the year, 1898, of the Court house and County records, of said Titus County, Texas, therefore, it is hereby ordered and declared by the Com. Court, of Titus Co Texas, that said common school district No. 29, of Titus Co. is now recognized, recognized and treated & continued since its establishment prior to the year 1906 has been recognized, regarded & treated by the Com. Court of Titus Co. and by all officers of this County charged with any duty in the administration within the County of the laws regulating and relating to public education and the maintenance of public free schools, as the legally established existing common school district of Titus Co. within the boundary set out & declared in said order of Com. Court of Titus Co Tex of April 14, 1906,
