In the matter of setting the :
Salary of the County Judge :

On this day came on to be considered the matter of setting the salary of the County Judge, after duly considering the matter the Court is of the opinion that the County Judge's Ex-Officio Salary should be set at \$600.00 It is therefore ordered and adjudged that the Ex-Officio Salary of the County Judge of Titus County Texas, be set at the sum of \$600.00

In the Matter of vault :
adjoining the Court House :

Aug 15 1907.
On this day came on to be considered the matter of having the city of Mt. Pleasant vacate the Bottom story of the vault adjoining the Court house and there has been a previous order to that effect to have the Tax collector to have the lower story of said vault fixed up for his office. It is the order of the Court that the County Clerk notify the Authorities of said City of Mt. Pleasant to vacate said vault for the reason that it is needed for office.

In the Matter of Purchasing :
Court house supplies and stationery :
