In the matter of declaring result of an election in school District No. 12 - June 22nd 1908

On this day I am so to be considered the returns of an election

 This day the Court proceeded to count the vote of an election held at Ripley school house in School District No. 17. to determine whether or not a tax of (20) twenty cents on the (\$100.00) one hundred dollar worth of property will be levied for school purposes in School District No. 17. And it appearing to the Court that a 2/3 majority of all votes cast at said election were in favor of taxation. It is therefore ordered by the Court that there be levied upon the property in said District No. 17 a tax of (20) twenty cents on each \$100.00 worth of property for the year 1908 and that the same shall be collected for school purposes—

In the matter of an election held in School District No. 36 June 27th 1908
 This day the Court proceeded to count the vote of an election held at Sloggin's Chapel in School District No. 36. to determine whether or not a tax of (20) twenty cents on the \$100.00

One hundred dollars worth of property will be levied for school purposes in school district no. 36 - And it appearing to the Court that a 2/3 majority of all votes cast at said election were in favor of taxation - It is therefore ordered by the Court that there shall be levied upon the property in said school District no. 36 a tax of (20) twenty cents on each \$100.00 worth of property for the year 1908. And that the same shall be collected for school purposes -
