In the matter of the petition of A. P. King and others for a special school tax in School District No. 5 August 10th 1908. This day came on to be heard the petition of A. P. King and others filed at this term of Court. Asking the Court to order an election to be held in School District No. 5 for a special school tax of 20 Twenty cents on the \$100.00 worth of property in said School District No. 5. And it appearing to the Court said said petition is in proper form and signed by a majority of the free holders of said School District No. 5. It is therefore ordered by the Court that said petition be granted. And that an election be held at Pleasant Hill in said common school District No. 5. Blue County Texas on the 12th day of September A. D. 1908. to determine whether or not a special tax of 20 Twenty cents should be levied upon each \$100.00 worth of property in said School District No. 5 for the purpose of supplementing the state school appropriated to said School District. It is further ordered by the Court that A. P. King, J. W. Hest and G. J. Maxton are hereby appointed to hold said election. And the Sheriff of Blue County Texas is hereby directed and required to give notice of such election by posting three notices of such election in said School District No. 5. And no two in the same place

It is therefore ordered by the Court that said Barney Webber be and he is hereby declared a pauper and placed upon the pauper list at the rate of \$10.00 per month. and the Clerk of this Court will issue warrants in accordance with this order until otherwise notified by the Court
