In the Matter of allowing accounts.

On this day December 28th A. D. 1909, there came on to be considered the following accounts which were received and allowed.

In the matter of Gretia Andersen, A Pauper

December 28th 1909. On this day came on to be considered the matter of Gretia Andersen a Pauper of Titus County, and it appearing to the Court that said Gretia Andersen is now residing in Franklin County and has been for some time and that the court should no longer keep her on the pauper list, It is therefore ordered adjudged and decreed by the court that the said Gretia Andersen remain on the said Pauper list.

In the matter of Sid Riley a Pauper.

December 28th A. D. 1909, On this day came on to be considered the matter of placing Sid Riley on the County and allowing him \$10.00 per month, and it appearing to the Court that the said Riley has been adjudged a Lunatic and that he can not now be placed in asylum for want of room and that \$10.00 is cheaper than he can be kept in jail. It is therefore ordered and adjudged that that the said Sid Riley be allowed the sum of \$10.00 per month and that same be paid to his wife.

In the matter of Purchasing Common School District Bonds.

December 28th A. D. 1909. On this day came on to be considered the matter of purchasing Common School District bonds of District No. 5 amounting to \$500.00, District No. 7, amounting to \$1200.00 and District No. 13 amounting to \$500.00, It appearing to the Court that said bonds are for sale and that the State of Texas, has waived its option on said bonds, and that said bonds can be bought at par and accrued interest. It is therefore ordered adjudged and decreed by the Court that said bonds be bought and taken up by the permanent School funds of Titus County, Texas.

In the Matter of Advertising Titus County School Land for sale.

December 28th A. D. 1909, On this day came on to be considered the matter of advertising Titus County School land Situated in Titus County for sale. It appearing to the Court that said land is not bringing in any revenue as it is but that if it can be sold for a fair price and draw a good rate of interest that it will be to the interest of the School fund to sell it. It is therefore ordered adjudged and decreed by the court that said School land be advertised for sale to the highest bidder at the February term of Commissioners Court which will be Feb 14th 1910. And that purchaser is to have 40 years in which to pay for said land at the rate of 5% interest per annum, and an option to pay for same in five years.

In the matter of Convicts.

December 28th 1909, On this day came on to be considered the matter of keeping convicts on read and not allow them to be brought back to jail unless when sick. It appearing to the Court that a great deal of time is lost in bringing convicts in and carrying them out once a week and further more that when a convict is put in jail Saturday Evening and remain there until Monday Morning that there is a three days beard bill to pay and that it will be to the interest of the County to keep convicts out on the read Sundays instead of keeping them in jail. It is therefore ordered adjudged and decreed by the court that all County Convicts unless sick remain out on read in camps during the time they are working out fines and not be placed in jail.
