In the matter of reducing the valuation of 776 acres of the J. F. Lund survey in Titus County.

April 11th A. In the Matter of Paying Convict Guards.

April 11th A. It is therefore ordered adjudged and decreed by the court that said guards receive the sum of \$2.00 per day in cash.
