#### In the Matter of J. P. Boyd a Pauper.

Nov. 16 1910, on this day came on to be considered the matter of allowing J. P  
Boyd the sum of \$7.50 per month, and it appearing to the court that he is an old man without  
support and is unable to make his support and the County will have to take care of him.  
It is therefore ordered by the court that he be allowed the sum of \$7.50 per month.

#### In the matter of the Petition of C. T. Ludlow et als. for General Stock Law election in Precinct. no. 1. Titus County.

November 16th , 1910, on this day came on to be considered the Petition of C. T. Ludlow  
and Fifty Seven others for an election to be ordered in Precinct No. 1 for the purpose of  
~~Establishing a stock law in said Precinct No. 1.~~ determining whether or not  
horses, mules, jacks, jennets and cattle shall be permitted to run at large in said precinct  
No. 1.

Said Justice Precinct No. 1. of Titus County, Texas, being described by metes and  
bounds as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point where the County line public road intersects the Mt. Pleasant  
and Evans Bridge Public Road about five miles North of the town of Mt. Pleasant— Thence with  
said Mt. Pleasant and Evans Bridge Public road North to White Oak Creek— Thence West with  
the Meanderings of said White Oak Creek to the point where the line between Justice Pre No.  
1. and Pre No. 2 of said Titus County intersects said White Oak creek— Thence South with the  
West boundary line of Justice Pre. No. 1. and the East Boundary line of Justice Pre No. 2 &  
of said Titus County to Cypress Creek— Thence east with the Meanderings of said Creek to  
the South West corner of Justice Pre No. 5 and South East corner of Justice Pre No. 1. of said  
Titus County— Thence North with West Boundary line of Justice Pre Precincts No. 5 & 4 to  
the County line Public Road at and near the Liberty Hill Cemetery— Thence West with said

County line public road to the place of Beginning.  
after considering the said petition, It appearing to the Court that said petition was gotten up in due form and was signed by 80 free Holders praying for an election to be held in said pre No. 1 to determine whether or not horses, mules, Jacks and Jernets and cattle shall be permitted to run at large in said Pre No. 1. It is therefore ordered by the Court that an election be held in said Justice Pre No. I. on Dec. 31, 1910, and that the polls be opened according at the three voting boxes in said Pre Mt. Pleasant West Side No. I. Mt. Pleasant East Side No. II. and at Green Hill and that the County Judge Shall appoint election managers for said election according to law to hold said election to determined whether or not the above named stock shall be permitted to run at large in said pre No. I.

In the matter of Petition of Sam Foster.

November 23 1910 On this day came on to be considered the matter of allowing Sam Foster the sum of \$7.50 per month and it appearing to the court that he is an old negro without support or any one to care for him It is therefore ordered by the court that he be allowed \$7.50 per month.

In the matter of Wood for Court House.

Nov. 19th 1910. On this day came on to be considered the matter of Furnishing Wood for Court house, and it appearing to the court that the law requires the Gen. Court to furnish wood for the various offices . It is therefore ordered by the Court that the sum of \$6.00 be allowed for each office for wood for this winter.
