

Oct Term, A.D. 1911.

Be it remembered that on Oct 9th 1911 there was begun and had been within and for the County of Tulare a regular monthly term of the Tulare County Superior Court with W.E. Riddle County Judge presiding and Commissioners A.P. Snark, H.W. Wash, R.J. Tracy and A.O. Brown, a S. Tulare County const and J. L. Cooper Sheriff present when the following proceedings were had to-wit, —

In the matter of canvassing election of Oct 9th 1911 returns of election for Bond issue <sup>3</sup> on this day come on for Rauper farm <sup>3</sup> to be considered by the

Court the matter of canvassing election returns of an election held Sept 23 A.D. 1911 for the purpose of determining whether or not bonds should be issued on the Ranch a fund to the amount of \$6000<sup>00</sup> for the purpose of building and equipping a Rauper farm, and the Court finds from said returns that there were cast at said election 119 votes for said bond issue and 799 votes against said bond issue.

It is therefore ordered and adjudge by the Court that the results of said election be so declared and that said Bond is failed to carry.

On the matter of declaring result <sup>Oct 9 - 1911</sup> of an election held in School District No <sup>3</sup> on this day in Block 100 for Special Tax. Came on to be considered the matter of canvassing election returns of an election held in School District No — Block 100 for the purpose of rating a special Tax of 20 cents on the 100<sup>th</sup> valuation of property subject to taxation in said School District and it appearing to the Court from the returns of said election held Sept 23rd 1911, that there were cast for said special Tax 24 votes and against said special Tax 12 votes. It is therefore ordered and adjudge and declared by the Court that said special Tax is carried and that it shall be levied on all Taxable property in said District here after.

On the Matter of the petition of Oct 9th 1911, on this day  
W.L. Rasmussen & all for 3 come on to be considered the  
General Stock Law Court no 3 petition of W.L. Rasmussen et al  
for an election to be ordered for Justice Precinct No  
8, for the purpose of determining whether or not horses  
mules, Jacobs Jemmies and cattle shall be permitted to  
run at large in said precinct, and it appearing  
to the Court that said petition is in good form  
and signed by the required number of voters.

It is therefore ordered by the Court that said  
petition be and the same is in all respects  
granted, and said election is hereby ordered to be  
held in said precinct on Nov 25-a.d. 1911, to de-  
termine whether or not horses mules Jacobs Jemmies  
and cattle shall be permitted to run at large

On the matter of changing date of Oct 9-1911  
of holding Justice Court in 3 on this day come on to  
Overrule no 4 Cooksville 3 to consider the matter  
of changing date of holding Justice Court in  
Precinct No 4, and it appearing to the Court that  
the regular Court day is the 1st Monday which is the same  
date as Justice Precinct no 7, and that R.J. Gray  
J.P. of Precinct No 4 is County Commissioner and that  
Commissioners Court convene every second Monday  
which would make it inconvenient for him to  
hold court on second Monday it is therefore  
ordered and adjudged that the date of holding  
Justice in Precinct no 4 be and the is hereby  
changed to the second Monday in each month
