May commissioners, A.S. Mitchell County Clerk, and J.A. Casper Sheriff. ~~Shiff~~ when the following proceedings were had to-wit:-

Oct 14-1912.

On this day came on to be considered the petition of Tom Temper et al. lawyers & public road of the 2nd class to-wit:- Beginning at a point on the Evans Bridge and starting Bluff public road near Oak Harris at the corner of his pasture - thence across said Harris land in a west course to the Widow Blalock's East line - thence west across her land north of house, - thence west across Libenstein's land - thence west on said land line of Virgil Blalock's - thence N. to the Page land - thence W. with the old Pittman and Page land line to Pittman N.W. corner - thence to the Tunny land line - thence west with the Tunny S. Land line to the Dyer land - thence west across said land to F.R. McLean's land thence west with said line to J. Fry's E.S. line the corner of said Fry's land - thence west with J. Fry's & Blalock's line to Will Fry's - thence with Will Fry's line in front of his house and with the road from W. Fry's to the John Fry place - thence with the public to frame and it appearing to the Court that said petition is signed by the required number of freeholders and that said road petition should be granted and said road declared a second class road when put in good order and same to be put in good condition to no expense to the County. It is therefore ordered that said petition be granted as prayed for and that said road be opened up with no expense to the County.

\$2000⁰⁰ in School Bonds, issued upon the faith and credit of common school dist no 11 & this county, Texas, and it appearing to the Court that said bonds were issued for the purpose of building and equipping a school house and it appearing further that the permanent school fund has funds on hand that should be invested and that this is a good investment for same. It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court that said bonds be purchased and taken up by the permanent school fund.

We considered a petition of the Trustees of common school dist No 4, asking for an order permitting them to sell at public auction the old school house and grounds in said dist. and it appearing to the Court that dist has built a new school building and an order has been made by them and that they have no further use for the old building & grounds. It is therefore ordered, adjudged that said trustees sell the old building and grounds on which it is located to the highest bidder.
