

Dec Term A.D. 1912.

Be it remembered that on Dec. 9<sup>th</sup> 1912 there came on a regular session of the commissioners court of Tilden county, Texas, with Don Patre county judge presiding. A. P. Smar, C. O. Brown, H. I. Combs and Mr. Thompson commissioners present. J. A. Cooper Sheriff, W. L. Kelley county clerk, when the following proceedings were had to wit:

In the matter of approving & Dec. 9<sup>th</sup> 1912 on this day  
 bonds of county officers } come on to be examined  
 and considered the following  
 named officers. L. H. Armstrong Notary and  
 after being examined the same was approved by  
 the court being found in proper form and the amount  
 specified by law. It is therefore ordered & adjudged and  
 decreed by the court that the said bond be and the same  
 is hereby approved.

In the matter of Petition } Dec. 9<sup>th</sup> 1912. On this day  
 of T. R. McLeon et al for } come on to be heard the Petition  
 for a stock law } of T. R. McLeon and others, and  
 after being considered by the court the same was approved  
 and the following order is made:

### Stock Law election

On this the 9<sup>th</sup> day of December 1912 came on to be considered by the commissioners court of Tilden county Texas a petition signed by Dr. R. McLeon and 37 other citizens praying for a stock law election to be held in justice precinct No. 3 of Tilden county Texas, to determine whether hogs, sheep & goats shall be permitted to run at large or not in the said justice precinct No. 3 of Tilden county Texas.

The said justice precinct No. 3 of Tilden county Texas being described by metes and bounds as follows. To wit:  
 Beginning at the NW cor. of Tilden county Texas, on the point of Sulphur River where said line intersects said stream, thence south with the NB line of Tilden county Texas, to white oak brush, thence in an easterly direction with the meandering of said stream and down the same to the EB line of Tilden county, thence coming being the NB line of Morris county, Texas, thence N. with said line come to Sulphur River the NE corner of Tilden county Texas, thence up said stream in a westerly direction, to the place of beginning.

the petition being found in the proper form and signed by the required number of freeholders of said Justice precinct number three, Titus county Tex. it is therefore ordered that said election be held on the 18th day of January 1913, and that the polls be open at 8 o'clock a.m. and close at 7 o'clock p.m. at Talco & Mopse Springs voting places in said Justice precinct number three of Titus County Tex so that the free holders of said Justice precinct shall may determine here whether or not hogs, sheep and goats be permitted to run at large in said precinct number three of Titus County, Tex

H.M. King is hereby appointed manager of said voting precinct at Talco, Tex. and Virgie, Seaback manager of said voting precinct at Mopse Springs. Said Managers are each allowed three assistants, who are free holders and who have their poll tax or exemption certificate, and who will allow none but freeholders who have their poll tax or have certificates of exemption to vote. On this day come on to be considered the final Report of C. Cleland, Tax collector and after examining same and found correct the said report is hereby approved.

In the matter of petition }  
of T. B. Temple } Dec. 9<sup>th</sup> 12

On this day come on to be heard and considered the petition of T. B. Temple, et al to declare the herein described road, a public highway instead of a public Road. To wit:

Beginning at Ewan's Bridge and running N.W. across the west end of land to John Steen. Thence W. to R.W. Pitman land, across the land of J. P. Poye. Thence N. across the land of J. P. Poye. Thence North. across the J. T. Long land, and thence W., across for Temple's land. Thence W. across Ross Blom land. Thence W. across Jim More's land to the John Fry place to where a new road which has been petitioned for in the road.

Term of the Commissioners court interests come and after being considered by the court it is of the opinion that said road be and the same is hereby declared a public highway instead of a public Road.
