

In re application for
new roads by FR French
et al - Report of jury
of view and judgment
of cases shown

May 13th, 1913.

On this day came
on to be heard the
report of the jury of

view to survey and lay out a road begin-
ning at a point known as FR French's mill
lying about 5 miles south of Mt Pleasant and
terminating at a point running thence in
a western direction to the Mt. Pleasant & Pitts-
burg public road. Said report being as follows:
To the Honorable Commissioners Court of Pitts County,
The undersigned jurors acting under the
order of this Court made on the 13th day
of August, A.D. 1912, after being duly sworn,

did on the 16th day of January, A.D. 1913, proceed to lay out and survey a road beginning at French mill and terminating on a point, in the Pittsburg and Mr. Pleasant public roads, and at the same time proceeded to assess the damages incident to the opening of said roads, after leaving given notice to the land owners through whose land said road runs.

The field notes of said survey, and description of said road are as follows:

Beginning at a point known as J.R. French's mill lying about 5 miles south of Mr. Pleasant's place, thence west to French's W.B. line and Byrd's E.B. line a distance of 834 feet; thence north with Byrd's E.B. line 1900 feet to Byrd's N.E. corner. Thence east with Byrd's N.W. line passing his N.E. corner in all west 4665 feet; thence north 1100 feet. Thence west 1200 feet intersect the Mr. Pleasant and former Pittsburg public roads, and thence John Byrd, John Hargrove, D.M. Hicks, Verne Adams and J.R. French, owners of the land through which said road runs, having claimed no damages, respectively, we hereby assess the damages as nothing.

All of which is respectfully submitted for the orders of the court.

 of the second class.
