Be it remembered that on Nov. 10<sup>th</sup>  
1913 there was begun and held a Regular  
Term of the Hon. Commissioners Court of  
Sam Palo Judge Presiding, G. O. Bigon J. S.  
Cameron, W. Thompson, and A. P. Sneed  
Commissioners when the following  
proceedings were had &-wif:

In the Mother of the Petition  
P. L. Carpenter et al for an election & On this the 10<sup>th</sup>  
to determine whether the sale of any & day Nov. 1913  
intoxicating liquors shall be prohibited  
In Titus County Texas

On this the 10<sup>th</sup> day of Nov  
A. D. 1913 at a regular term of the County Commissioners  
Court in and for Titus County Texas there came on  
to be considered by the said court the petition of  
P. L. Carpenter and Two Hundred and Sixty six other  
qualified voters of the said county in and for said  
Titus County Texas to determine whether or not the  
sale of intoxicating liquors shall be prohibited in  
said Titus County and it appearing to the said  
court that the said petition for the said election is  
true and legal form and is signed by more than  
(250) Two Hundred and Fifty qualified voters of Titus  
County Texas.

It is therefore considered and ordered by the County  
Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas of a  
regular term thereof that on election be held in  
same is hereby believed to be held on and for  
Titus County Texas on Tuesday the 6<sup>th</sup> day of November  
A. D. 1913 to be held by the qualified voters  
of the said Titus County Texas in order that the said  
qualified voters of said Titus County Texas may  
determine by legal ballot in said election whether  
or not the sale of intoxicating liquors shall be  
prohibited in said Titus County Texas.

And it is further ordered by the said County  
Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas that  
said regular term thereof that the said election  
be held at each and all of the several regular voting

boars, and places within and for the said Tarrant County, Texas, in accordance with the election laws in such cases made and provided for the State of Texas, on the said 6<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D. 1913, the same being more than fifteen days and less than thirty days from the date of this order.

And it is further ordered and decreed by the said County Commissioners Court of the County, Texas, of said regular term, that the following persons, who are the persons required to hold general and special elections, from the same are hereby appointed to hold the said election on the said 6<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D. 1913.

 determine whether or not the sale of intoxicating  
 liquors shall be prohibited in said Titus County  
 and is appearing by the said court that the said  
 petition for the said election is in due and legal  
 form and is signed by more than Two Hundred  
 and Fifty (150) qualified voters of Titus County, Texas  
 It is therefore considered and ordered by the  
 County Commissioners Court of Titus County,

That of a regular term thereof that an election be  
 held and the same is hereby ordered to be held in  
 and for Titus County, Texas, on Saturday the 6<sup>th</sup> day of  
 December, A.D. 1913, to be held by the qualified voters  
 of the said Titus County, Texas in order that the  
 said qualified voters of said Titus County, Texas  
 may determine by legal ballot in said election  
 whether or not the sale of intoxicating liquors shall  
 be prohibited in said Titus County, Texas.

And it is further ordered by the said  
 County Commissioners Court of Titus County,  
 of good regular term thereof, that the said election  
 be held at each and all of the several regular voting  
 places and places within and for the said Titus  
 County, Texas, in accordance with the election  
 laws in such cases made and provided for the  
 State of Texas, on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of Dec. A.D. 1913, the com-  
 munity more than fifteen days and less than thirty  
 days from the date of this order.

And it is further ordered and decreed by the said County Commissioners Court of Fulton County, of said regular term that the following persons, who are the persons required to hold general and special elections, be and the same are hereby appointed to hold the said election on the said 6<sup>th</sup> day of Dec. A.D. 1913.
