Be it Remembered that, on Nov. 10<sup>th</sup> 1913 There was begun and holden a Regular Term of the Hon. Commissioners Court for Sam Pater Judge Presiding of C. Beason J. S. Bourson, W. Thompson, and A. P. Smith - Commissioners when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

In the Matter of the Petition of L. L. Carpenter et al for an election to determine whether the sale of intoxicating liquors shall be prohibited in Titus County, Texas

On this the 10<sup>th</sup> day Nov. 1913.

On this the 10<sup>th</sup> day of Nov. A. D. 1913, at a regular term of the county Commissioners Court in and for Titus County, Texas, there came on for consideration by the said court the petition of L. L. Carpenter and Two Hundred and Sixty six other qualified voters of the said county in and for said Titus County, Texas, to determine whether or not the sale of intoxicating liquors shall be prohibited in said Titus County, and it appearing to the said court that the said petition for the said election is in due and legal form and is signed by more than (250) Two Hundred and Fifty qualified voters of Titus County, Texas.

It is therefore considered and ordered by the county Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, at a regular term thereof, that an election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held in and for Titus County, Texas, on Saturday the 6<sup>th</sup> day of December, A. D. 1913, to be held by the qualified voters of the said Titus County, Texas, in order that the said qualified voters of said Titus County, Texas, may determine by legal ballot in said election whether or not the sale of intoxicating liquors shall be prohibited in said Titus County, Texas.

And it is further ordered by the said County Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, at said regular term thereof, that the said election be held at each and all of the several regular voting

toys, and places within and for the said Teras county, Texas, in accordance with the election laws in such cases made and provided for the State of Texas, on the said 6<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D. 1913, the same being more than fifteen days and less than thirty days from the date of this order.

And it is further ordered and decreed by the said County Commissioners Board of Teras County, Texas, of said regular term, that the following persons who are the persons required to hold general and special elections, be and the same are hereby appointed to hold the said election on the said 6<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D. 1913.

 Texas of a regular term thereof that an election be  
 held and the same is hereby ordered to be held in  
 and for Teras County, Texas on Saturday the 6<sup>th</sup> day of  
 December, A.D. 1913, to be held by the qualified voters  
 of the said Teras County, Texas in order that the  
 said qualified voters of said Teras County, Texas  
 may determine by legal ballot in said election  
 whether or not the sale of intoxicating liquors shall  
 be prohibited in said Teras County, Texas

And it is further ordered by the said  
 county commissioners Court of Teras County,  
 of said regular term thereof, that the said election  
 be held at each and all of the several regular voting  
 boxes and places within and for the said Teras  
 County, Texas in accordance with the election  
 laws in such cases made and provided for the  
 State of Texas, on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of Dec. A.D. 1913, the same  
 being more than fifteen days and less than thirty  
 days from the date of this order.
