Be it Remembered that on 12th day of Jan 1914 there was begun and holden a regular Term of the Hon. Commissioners' Court of Titus County Texas, Hon. John Porter Co. Judge, A.P. Smart, O. Brown, J. Thompson and J.T. Compton Commissioners Present when the following proceedings were had to wit:

Shall Be Prohibited NOTICE OF ELECTION ^{To Determine} ~~IN~~ IN TITUS COUNTY TEXAS.

In the matter of the Petition of J.W. Allen et al for an election to determine whether or not pool rooms shall be prohibited in Titus County Texas.

On this, the 12th day of January 1914, at a regular term

monthly term of the County Commissioners' Court, in and for Titus County Texas, there came on to be considered by the said court the petition of J.W. Allen and 346 other qualified voters, praying this court to order an election to be held by the qualified voters of the said county, in and for said Titus County Texas, to determine whether or not pool rooms shall be prohibited in said Titus County Texas, said pool rooms as hereinafter defined; and it appearing to the said court that the said petition is in due and legal form and is signed by more than 10% of the qualified voters of Titus County Texas;

It is therefore, considered and ordered by the county Commissioners' Court of Titus County Texas, at a regular term thereof that an election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held in and for Titus County Texas, on Saturday, the 7th day of February A.D. 1914, to be held by the qualified voters of the said Titus County Texas, in order that the said qualified voters of said Titus County, Texas may determine by legal ballot in said election whether or not pool rooms shall be prohibited in said Titus County Texas.

The term pool hall or room, as used herein shall mean and include the following: any room, hall or building in which are exhibited any pool or billiard table or tables for the purpose of permitting games played thereon for hire, revenue, prize, fees, or gain of any kind.

It is further ordered by the said county commissioners' court of Titus County Texas at said regular monthly term thereof, that the said election be held at each and all of the several regular voting boxes and places within and for the said Titus County Texas, in accordance with the election laws in such cases made and provided for the State of Texas, on the 7th day of February 1914, the same being held within fifteen days and not more than thirty days from the date of this order.

It is further ordered and decreed by the said commissioners' Court of Titus County Texas at said regular monthly term that the following persons, who are the persons required to hold general and special elections be and the same are hereby appointed to hold the said election on Feb. 7th 1914.

of J.N. Norrmore et al for
Public Highway Jan 12. 1914

to be held the petition of J.N. Norrmore et al for public
Highway, said Petition as follows: Beginning
on the W. side of the Bridge on Shogoo Creek, West of
the town of Mt. Pleasant, Texas, and being about
3 1/2 miles from town of Mt. Pleasant and Sulphur
Springs Public Road and beginning on the
line between I.A. Hutton and Alice Robertson's
land. Thence north with said line 1/2 mile
to Robertson's N.E. corner. Thence west with the
line between said Hutton and Robertson's 1/4
of one mile to A.M. Shumote's S.E. corner
Thence north with the line between said Hutton
and Shumote 200 yds to L.B. Moulton's S.E. cor.
Thence west with the line between said Shu-
mote and Moulton's 400 yards. Thence north
across said Moulton's land to A.C. Knight's S.E.
corner. Thence west with the line between said
Knight and Moulton 150 yards to A.J. Mellican's N.E.
corner. Thence west with the line between the said
Knight and Mellican's land 200 yards. Thence
north with the line between said Mellican and
Knight's land 1/2 mile to J.N. Norrmore's S.E.
corner. Thence west with the line between said
Mellican and Norrmore's land 200 yds. Thence
west with the line between the land of said
Mellican and Norrmore 150 yards. Thence
west with the line between said Mellican and
Norrmore's land 150 yards to Mrs S.R. Preston
S.E. corner. Thence west with the line between

said Mellison's Boston land 300 yds. by the
 S.E. corner of land owned by Hill heirs, thence W.
 with the line between land owned by said Mellison
 and Hill heirs 350 yds. to bloud Crofts N.E.
 corner, thence W. with the line between said Croft
 and Hill heirs land 300 yds. to Boston S.E. cor
 thence W. with the line between bloud Croft and
 Boston land 50 yds. to Lee Norwomere N.E. cor.
 thence W. with the line between Lee Norwomere and
 Boston land $\frac{1}{4}$ of one mile to Boston S.W. cor.
 thence north with the line between said Norwomere
 and Boston land 75 yds. to coldwells Anderson
 N.E. corner, thence west with the line between
 said Anderson and Norwomere's land to the
 Weyfield and Pleasant Hill Public Road
 at Lee Norwomere's N.W. corner.

Pool Halls shall be prohibited in Tatus County
Texas

In the matter of the
petition of W. Allen et al
for an election to determine
whether or not pool rooms
shall be prohibited in
Tatus County Texas

On this the 12th
day of January
1914 at a Regular
monthly Term
of the county com-
missioner's Court in and for Tatus County
Texas there came on to be considered by
the said court the petition of W. Allen
and 546 other qualified voters praying this court
to order an election to be held by the qualified
voters of the said County, in and for said
Tatus County Texas to determine whether or
not pool rooms shall be prohibited in said
Tatus County Texas, said pool rooms to be
more fully defined, and it appearing to the court
that the said petition is in due and legal form
and is signed by more than 10% of the qualified
voters of Tatus County Texas.

It is therefore considered and ordered
by the county Commissioner's Court of Tatus
County Texas at a regular term thereof that
an election be and the same is hereby ordered
to be held in and for Tatus County Texas on
Saturday, the 7th day of February A.D. 1914 to be held
by the qualified voters of said Tatus County
Texas may determine by legal ballot in
said election whether or not pool rooms shall
be prohibited in said Tatus County Texas.

The term pool hall or room, as used here-
in shall mean and include the following
any room hall or building in which are lo-
cated any pool or billiard table or tables for
the purpose of permitting of ones played thereon
for hire, reward, prize, fee, or gain of any kind
as further ordered by the said Court

Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas at said Regular monthly term thereof that the said election be held at each and all of the aforesaid regular voting and places within and for the said Titus County Texas in accordance with the election laws in such cases made and provided for the State of Texas on the 7th day of February 1914 the same being less than fifteen days and not more than thirty days from the date of this order

It is further ordered and decreed by the said Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas at said regular monthly term that the following persons who are required to hold general and special elections be and the same are hereby appointed to hold the said election on Feb 7th 1914
