Establishing New School District
School District. On this day come
you to be considered the
matter of establishing a
School District of Taxes No. It is therefore ordered
by the court that said Taxes School District be es-
tablished and which will be when outlined and bounded

Be it remembered that the commissioners court of Titus county, Texas convened in regular session at the court House in said county on the 15th day of April 1914 with the following members present to wit: Judge Porter County Judge, and County Commissioners Stewart, Cameron, Brahm and Thompson. The county Judge presiding.

What came on to be considered the matter of creating a common school district in Titus county, Texas. Commissioner Brown made a motion that the following order be passed, which was duly recorded:

"It is ordered, adjudged and decreed by the county commissioners court of Titus county Texas that also common school district number one be created to contain the the territory in Titus county Texas, described as follows to wit: situated in the North west corner of Titus county, Texas:

Beginning at the North East corner of Solomon W. Turner survey on Sulphur river, also north west corner of R. Stearns survey. Thence South to North Boundary line of F. M. Barnett survey. Thence west to the North west corner of F. M. Barnett survey. Thence South with East Boundary line of T. R. McLean survey to the North Boundary line of the James W. McCallough survey. Thence to East to the North East corner of the James W. McCallough survey. Thence South to the north west corner of the Alfred Watson survey. Thence East to the North North E. corner of Alfred Watson Survey. Thence South to the South West corner of the A. J. Fry survey. Thence East to the South East corner of

of said A. J. Fry survey. Thence south to the South West corner of said Watson survey.

Thence west to the east Boundary line of the John R. Slaughter survey. Thence South to the South East corner of John R. Slaughter survey. Thence west to the East North East corner of the Martin Vega Delgado survey. Thence South to the North Boundary line of Edward Hobbs survey. Thence west to the North West corner of said Hobbs survey. Thence south to White Oak creek. Thence west with the meanderings of said creek to the west Boundary line of Titus county and the East Boundary line of Franklin county. Thence north to the North West corner of Titus county and the North East corner of Franklin county on Sulphur river.

Thence East with the meandering of Sulphur River to the place of beginning containing the following survey of land. Wm. Walker 186 acres John M. Nugent 320 acres Ben Jones 320 acres Wm. The court finds the facts in con-
 nection with creation of said sch-
 ool district to be that the territory des-
 cribed contains not less than 2
 square miles of area that incre-
 asing this district no other dis-
 trict has been or will be reduced in
 square area to less than nine square
 miles. That there is no territory inclu-
 ded in this district that has been
 taken from any other district with-
 out standing bonds, and that the
 territory in this district does not
 include any territory that has her-
 tofore been in any county line school
 district.
