It is further ordered by the court that said 20c maintenance tax be levied assessed and collected for this year 1914

 no market value, then its real value.

 in the constitution and laws of this State
 relative to the valuation of taxable property
 and that we will faithfully perform all
 of the duties required of us under the constitu-

State of Texas & On the 5th day of June 1914, the
 County of Tarrant & Commissioners Court of Tarrant
 County convened in regular
 session all the members thereof to wit:
 Sam Porter County Judge and County Com-
 missioners Small Brown, Cameron and Thompson
 being present and among other proceedings
 had passed the following orders.

On this day as came into be considered the
 returns of an election on the 30th day of
 May 1914 but also common school district
 Number One of this County upon the ques-
 tion of issuing seven thousand dollars
 of school trust bonds for said district
 running 40 years with the option of redemp-
 tion at any time after one year and to be
 bearing five percent interest and levying
 a tax on all taxable property not to exceed
 twenty five cents on each one hundred dollars
 taxable valuation of all property in said
 district sufficient to pay current interest
 on said bonds and provide a sinking
 fund to pay the principal at maturity,
 and it appearing that said election was
 in all respects legally held and that said
 returns were duly and legally made
 and that there were cast of said election
 45 votes "For the bonds 40 votes"

"Against the Bonds 5 votes"

And it appearing to the court from said
 returns that a majority of the qualified
 property taxpayers of said district voting
 at said election voted in favor of issuing said
 bonds and for said tax the court was hereby de-
 clare the said tax to have been levied in conformity
 and the proposition for the issuance of said
 bonds to have been adopted and that this court
 is authorized to issue said bonds and to levy
 and have assessed and collected said tax

The court did pass the following order
 T. O. W. -

Whereas at an election held for the purpose on the 30th day of May 1914 a majority of the qualified electors of the County of Toledo, Ohio School District Number One of this County, voting of said election voted in favor of the issuance of the bonds herein by the described, and in favor of the tax hereunto to be levied.

It is therefore ordered by the Commissioners of the County of Toledo, Ohio, that said bonds be called "Toledo Government School District Number One School House Bonds" and be issued for and on the faith and credit of Toledo Common School District Number One of said County, as established by order of the commissioners of said County on April 15th 1914, which is of record in the minutes of said County in Vol. 13 pages, for the purpose of constructing and equipping a public free school building of brick, masonry in said district and purchasing a site therefor. Said bonds shall be numbered from one to fourteen inclusive shall be in denomination of Five Hundred Dollars each, aggregating ~~seventy~~ ^{seventy} thousand dollars.

They shall be dated July 1st 1914 and shall become due and payable 40 years after date with the option of redemption at any time after one year from date. They shall bear interest of the rate of four percent per annum from date until paid, payable on July 1st of each year. Principal and interest shall be payable to the effect of the county treasurer, in New York City, New York, and the said of Toledo shall be signed by the county judge, countersigned by the county clerk, and registered by the county treasurer and the seal of the County Commission. Each shall be impressed on each of them, the facsimile signatures of the county judge and county clerk shall be telegraphically printed or engraved on the coupons.

It is further ordered by the court that it pay interest on said Bonds and create

a sinking fund sufficient to discharge them of maturity, a tax of the rate of 25 cts on each one hundred dollars taxable valuation of all property subject to taxation in said government school district of this county shall be annually levied assessed and collected upon said property until said bonds with interest are paid and said tax is now here levied for they are 1914
