

Be it remembered, that the commissioners court of Niles County, Texas convened in special session at the Court house in said County on July 31st 1914, with County Judge Tom Porter and County Commissioners, Smart, Brown, Cameron and Thompson present, the County Judge presiding.

When came on to be considered the matter of defining the boundaries of Panthers Chapel Union school district number 19 of Niles County. It appearing to the said Court that the said district was established by the Commissioners court of Niles County, many years ago and prior to the year 1895. It also appearing to the Court that since the original creation of said district there have been changes made in the boundaries of the same by reason of the creation of other school districts as well as by changes having been made in its boundaries. It further appearing to the court that no changes have been made in said district since the year 1909.

Now therefore, for the purpose of making certain the existence of said district, be it ordered adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Niles County, Texas That Panthers Chapel Union school district number 19 of Niles County, Texas be re-established to contain the territory remaining in said district. That said district be described as follows to wit: Situated in Niles County, Texas about 3 miles South West from Mount Pleasant, Texas. Beginning at the place where Fairweather Creek empties into Big Cypress Creek in the Henry B Hutchings survey. Thence West with the meanderings of Big Cypress Creek to the South West corner of Justice precinct number one of said County in the South Boundary line of the Joseph Murcham section. Thence North with the West Boundary line of said Justice precinct 8200 rods to a point in the John H. Keith survey. Thence East to the East boundary line of P.M. Oliver's survey. Thence South 1100 rods to a stake in the J.M. Oliver survey, which is also the South West corner of the Mt. Pleasant independent school district. Thence East to the East Boundary line of the John Gammie survey, a stake in Fairweather Creek. Thence South with the meanderings of said creek to the South Boundary line of said John Gammie survey. Thence South 1497 yards to a stake in the Odaniel R. Patton survey. Thence East 200 yards

a stake on said Gauversley Creek. Then South East with said creek 1490 varas to the North Boundary line of the Godfrey Etheridge survey. Then East to the North East corner of said Etheridge survey. Then South 530 varas to the South East corner of said Etheridge survey - Then South with the measuring of said Gauversley Creek to Big Cypress Creek the place of Beginning, containing the following named surveys and the acres shown to be contained in each, to wit:

Be it remembered that on the 31st day of July 1916 the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas convened in special session at the court house in said county with Judge Sam Porter, Commissioners Smart, Brown, Cameron and Thompson, present and participating.

When came on to be considered the matter of redefining Marshall Springs Common School District No. 18 of Titus County, Texas. It appearing to the court that said district was created by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas many years ago, prior to the year 1858, and that changes have been made in said district from time to time. It further appearing that the records of Titus County, Texas were destroyed by fire in the year 1895 and that the minutes of the commissioners court of said county were also destroyed in said fire.

Now, therefore, for the purpose rendering certain the boundaries of said district, The Commissioners Court of said county after a full hearing of the facts order, adjudges and decrees that Marshall Springs Common School District of Titus County Texas as heretofore created at this time is within the following boundaries, to wit; Situated in Titus County, Texas about 7 miles North West from the town of Mt. Pleasant, Texas. Beginning at the North West corner of the R. Overton 16 labor survey in said county. Thence West crossing the Wm. D. Foy and F. J. Charver surveys to the County line between Titus and Franklin Counties. Thence North to the North Boundary line of H. Dembricki survey. Thence East to the West Boundary line of the Thomas Hunt survey which is also the North East corner of the William Walkup survey. Thence South to the South West corner of the Thomas Hunt survey. Thence East to the North East corner of the Martin G. Miller survey. Thence South to the South West corner of the Hrs. of Wm. Aiken survey. Thence East to the North East corner of the Hugh A. Lamb survey. Thence South to the South West corner of the Joseph D. Black survey. Thence East to the South East corner of the Joseph D. Black survey. Thence South to the South East corner of the William Woolridge survey. Thence East with the South Boundary line of the Wm. C. Ardlett survey to the West Boundary line of the William Tuberville survey. Thence South to the South Boundary line of the John A. Christian survey. Thence East to the

Paris and Mt. Pleasant public road on the North Boundary line of the James W. Green survey. Thence with said road South East direction to the East Boundary line of the said Green survey. Thence North to the North West corner of the Thomas G. Forbes survey. Thence East to the North East corner of J.H. Colleys tract of land out of said Forbes survey in the N.E. line of said survey. Thence South to the South boundary line of said Forbes survey. Thence South East with the Paris and Mt. Pleasant public road to the East Boundary line of the James Hays survey 411 varas North from the South East corner of said survey. Thence South to the South East corner of said Hays survey. Thence West with the South Boundary line of said Hays survey to the East Boundary line of the Abner Hill survey. Thence South to the North East corner of A.J. Hilton's 100 acre tract of land in the South East corner of said Hill survey. Thence West to the North West corner of the Benson land. Thence North 368 varas a stake. Thence West 408 varas a stake. Thence North 562 varas a stake. Thence West 86 varas a stake. Thence North 310 varas a stake. Thence West to the East Boundary line of the R. Overton survey which is also the West boundary line of the Abner Hill survey. Thence North to the North East corner of the tract of land now owned by Chalmers Fleming in said Overton survey. Thence West to the North West corner of a tract of land now owned by E.S. Summerlin in said Overton survey. Thence South to the South East corner of the Link tract of land also in said Overton survey. Thence West with Kirk's South Boundary Line to his South West corner. Thence North to the North Boundary line of the Richard Overton survey. Thence West to the place of beginning. Containing the following surveys and parts of surveys with the acreage shown to be contained in each.
