

Sept Term 1915

Be it Remembered that on the 13th day Sept 1915 the Commissioners Court of Teton County, Texas, convened in regular session at the Court House in the City of Mt Pleasant Texas in said county with Sam Porter County Judge, Smart King Fleming and Sims County Commissioners, W. L. Kelly County Clerk and J. A. Cooper Sheriff present. When, came on to be considered the matter of the issuance of the bonds on Common School District Number 9 of Teton County, Texas.

It appearing to the Court that an order was passed on June 24, 1915, providing for the issuance of said bonds and that the said order is defective.

It is therefore ordered by the court that said order be quashed and the same shall read as follows to-wit:

Where at an election held for the purpose on the 15th day of May 1915, a majority of the qualified property tax paying voters of Common School District No 9 of Teton County, Texas, voting at said election, voted in favor of the issuance of the bonds hereinafter described and in favor of the type hereinafter provided:

It is therefore ordered by the Commissioners Court of said County, that the bonds of said district to be called "Common School District No 9, School House Bonds", be issued on the faith and credit of Common School District No 9 of said County, for the purpose of providing funds for the payment of accounts legally contracted in constructing and equipping a public free school building within said district and purchasing a site therefor.

Said bonds shall be numbered from one to sixteen inclusive shall be in denominations of One Hundred

each aggregating Seven Hundred Dollars.  
 They shall be dated October 1st 1915 and shall become due and payable twenty years after date with the option of redemption at any time after one year from date. They shall bear interest from date at the rate of five per cent per annum payable annually on October 1st of each year. Principal and interest shall be payable upon presentation and surrender of bonds or proper coupons in lawful money of the United States at the Office of the Treasurer of the State of Texas, the Office of the County Auditor of Tarrant County, Texas, or at the Office of Standard National Bank, New York City, N.Y. at the option of the holder. The said bonds shall be signed by the County Judge and County Clerk of Tarrant Co. Texas and shall bear the seal of the Commissioners Court impressed on each of them.

The facsimile signatures of the County Clerk may be lithographed, engraved or printed on said coupons.

This further ordered that to pay interest on said bonds and create a sinking fund to discharge them of maturity a tax of twenty five cents upon each One Hundred Dollars total valuation of taxable property in said district shall be levied and is hereby now levied for the year 1915 and a sufficient rate shall be levied each year thereafter to pay interest and create a sinking fund for said bonds until said bonds and interest are fully paid.
