

Be it Remembered that the commissioners court of Titus County, Texas convened in a regular session at the court house of said county, in the city of Mt. Pleasant, Texas, on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1916, with the following members present, to-wit: Sam Porter, County Judge, County commissioners, Smart, ~~H.~~ Lipscomb and Thorndis, County Clerk, W.L. Kelley and Sheriff John A. Cooper, present:

When cause will be considered, the returns of an election held in Justice Precinct No. 3, of Titus County, Texas, on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1916, whereupon County Commissioners A.P. Smart made a motion that the following order be passed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner E.C. Sims the order is as follows, to-wit:

"It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that the returns of an election held in Justice Precinct No. 3, of Titus County, Texas, on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1916, have been made by all the officers of election of the election precincts situated in said Justice precinct, though they are all in paper form and not in printed form, that the said election was in all respects fully and properly held, and it appearing that there will be cost of the said election \$110.00.

That there were cost of the said election for the issuance of the Coupon Bonds of Justice Precinct No. 3, of Titus County, Texas, for the purposes of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized roads and bridges, roads of return price being in six years, and the boy assessment and collection of an annual tax against all taxable property within said Precinct of a rate sufficient to pay the interest on the said bonds as it accrues and to create a sinking fund with which to pay the principal thereof at maturity, 74,000 dollars.

That he were cost against the issuance of the coupon bonds of Justice Preliminary No 3. of Titus County, Texas, the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating Melodonyard, graded and paved roads and turn pikes and in aid thereof and the levy assessment and collection of one cent to a tax against all lots of property within said precinct of a rate sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as if agreed and to create a sinking fund with which to pay the principal thereof of maturity 37 years.

If further appearing to the court that two thirds of all the votes cast for said election were cast in favor of the bonds and the tax,

It is therefore ordered and judged and decreed by the court that the said election resulted in favor of the issuance of the coupon bonds of Justice Preliminary No 3. of Titus County, Texas, and the levy of a tax to pay principal and interest thereof.

The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of the Commissioners Court with the request that as many as voted the passage of the order be voted. Thereupon County Commissioners Smith ~~H.~~ Sims, and Thomas Titus Agg, voted in the affirmative. The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

The foregoing minutes of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, was read and approved on this the 19<sup>th</sup> day of Feb. 1916.

Be it remembered that the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Tex., convened in regular session at the Court House in said County, in the city of Mt. Pleasant, Tex., on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1916, and continued in session until and including the 19<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1916, with the following members present, to wit: Sam Park, County Judge; County Commissioners, Frank Hamblin, L. C. Ogden, Frank H. Kelley, and Fred Cooper, Sheriff present.

When came up to be considered the returns of an election held in Justice Precinct No. 1 of Titus County, Tex., on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of Feb. 1916. It appearing to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Tex., that the returns from each of the voting places or precincts within said Justice Precinct had been made and delivered by the Election Officers who held said elections, as required by law. And it further appearing upon a comparison of the said election returns that there were cast at the said election 997 votes, of which number there were cast for the issuance of the Coupon Bonds of Justice Precinct No. 1, of Titus County, Tex., for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating Macdonald's gas oil and gas road, and tank pipes, and in aid thereof said the City assessment and Col. Section 1/4 an equal tax against all taxable property in said precinct, of a total sufficient to pay the interest on said bond, so as it matures and to create a sinking fund with which to pay the principal thereof at maturity, 738 votes, and of which number there were cast against the issuance of the Coupon Bonds of Justice Precinct No. 1, of Titus County, Tex., for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating Macdonald's gas oil and gas roads and tank pipes and in aid thereof said

The levy assessment and collection of an  
annual tax against all taxable property in  
said precinct of a rate sufficient to pay  
the interest on said bonds and matured  
and to create a sinking fund with which to  
pay the principal thereof at maturity 159 votes.

J. H. Culp, County Commissioner  
A. P. Suydam made a motion that the following  
order be passed by the commissioners <sup>court</sup>  
of Tulia County T. G. S. which motion was  
seconded by County Commissioner E. C.  
Limp. The order is as follows to wit:

Whereas an election was held in Precinct  
Precinct No. 1 of Tulia County T. G. S. on the 15<sup>th</sup>  
day of February 1916 on the question of the  
issuance of the coupon Bonds of said  
precinct to the amount of Two Hundred  
Thousands Dollars for the purpose of construct-  
ing, maintaining and operating Mocod  
canned products, and canned foods and  
Tuna Fish and in aid thereof and the  
levy assessment and collection of an  
annual tax against all taxable property  
in said precinct of a rate sufficient to  
pay the interest on said bonds as is matured  
and to create a sinking fund with which  
to pay the principal thereof at maturity,  
and it appearing from the returns of the  
said election that there were cast of the  
said election 997 votes of which 738 votes  
were cast in favor of the issuance of the  
bonds and the levy of the tax and 159 votes  
were cast against the issuance of the  
bonds and the levy of the tax.

It appearing that more than two  
thirds, majority of the votes cast of the said  
election were in favor of the issuance  
of the bonds and the levy of the tax.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and  
decided by the Commissioners Court of  
Tulia County T. G. S. that a two thirds

majority of the votes cast at the said election  
while cast in favor of the issuance of the  
bond and the levy of the tax.

The County Judge put the motion for  
a vote of the members of the Commission  
ers' court with the request that no money be  
spent the passage of the order to vote Yes  
and those who did not favor the passage  
of the order to vote No.

County Commissioners voted Yes,  
Thomas, Landman & Steddy &

The County Judge declared the motion  
carried and the order passed.
