

Be it remembered that the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas convened in special session thereof at the Court House in the City of Mt. Pleasant, Texas on the 21st day of March 1916 with Sam Porter, County Judge, County Commissioners J. M. King, S. M. Smith and Thomas County Clerk W. L. Kelley, and Sheriff Geo. A. Cooper present.

When came on to be considered the matter of providing for the issuance of the coupon bonds of Precinct No. 1 of Titus County, Texas, whereupon County Commissioner J. M. King made a motion that the following order be passed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, which motion was seconded by Commissioner A. P. Smith. The order is as follows, To Wit:

It appearing to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas that at an Election held for the Purpose in Justice Precinct No. 1 of Titus County, Texas, on the 15th day of February 1916, two-thirds of the Tax paying Voters of said Precinct voting at the said Election voted in favor of the issuance of the said Bonds - hereinafter described and that Levy of an Annual Tax against all Taxable Property of said Precinct of a Rate sufficient to pay the Interest on the said Bonds as it accrues and to create a sinking fund from which to pay the principal thereof at maturity.

And it appearing to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas that \$200,000.00 Bonds be authorized were by said Court on the 13th day of March 1916 ordered to be issued but all of the details of the issuance of said Bonds provided for, with the exception of a form of Bond and a form for the coupons evidencing interest to accrue on said Bonds and to be attached to each of said Bonds.

And it appearing to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas that it is advisable to provide for the Levy to fix the form of Bond of said \$200,000.00 Bonds issued authorized on the 15th day of February 1916 and a form of coupon to be attached to said Bonds evidencing the interest thereon.

And it appearing to the Commissioners Court of Teras County Texas that it is advisable to provide for the Levy of an Annual Tax against all taxable Property of Said Justice Precinct No 1 of a Rate sufficient to pay the interest on the said Bonds as it appears and to create a sinking fund from which to pay the Principal thereof at maturity

It is therefore ordered adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Teras County Texas that each of the \$200,000.00 Bonds of Road District No 1 of Teras County Texas heretofore ordered to be issued, to be of substantially the following form to wit

It appearing to the County Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas that an order was passed by it providing for the issuance of the Coupon Bonds of Justice Precinct No 3 of Titus County Texas on the 13th day of March 1916 and it now appears to the said Court that it is desirable to amend the said order so that hereafter it shall read as follows to wit.

It appearing to the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas that at an Election held for the purpose in Justice Precinct No 3 Titus County Texas on the 15th day of February 1916 two thirds of the Tax-paying Voters of said Precinct voting at said Election voted in favor of the issuance of the Bonds hereinafter described and the levy of an annual Tax against all Taxable Property of said Precinct of a Rate sufficient to pay the interest on the said Bonds as it accrues and to create a sinking fund with which to pay the Principal thereof at maturity.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged, and decreed by the Commission Court of Titus County Texas that Justice Precinct No 3 of Titus County be named Road District No 3 Titus County Texas and that the limit of Road District No 3 of Titus County Texas be raised to the amount of Twenty Five Thousand Dollars for the purpose of Constructing, Maintaining and Operating Macadamized gravel and Sand Roads

And Lump Sums and in aid thereof in said district the Bonds shall be numbered from 1 to 50 both inclusion and shall be in denomination of Five Hundred Dollars each. they shall be dated March 15th 1916 and shall mature as follows to wit.

Said Bonds shall be dated April 10th 1916 and shall bear interest at the rate of 5% per annum from date until paid, payable annually on April 10th 1916 and shall bear interest at the rate of 5% per annum from date until paid each year. They shall be numbered from 1 to 25, both inclusive and shall be in denominations of One Hundred Dollars each. The interest on said Bonds shall be evidenced by interest Coupons attached to each of said Bonds which shall be signed by the written printed or lithographed signatures of the County Judge and County Clerk of Titus County Texas. Both principal and interest of said Bonds shall be payable at the office of the County Depository of Titus County Texas - the office of the Treasurer of the State of Texas - or at Hanover National Bank, New York, N. Y. at the option of the holder. The seal of the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas shall be impressed upon each of said Bonds.

It is further ordered that for the purpose of paying the interest on said Bonds as it matures there is now levied for the year 1916 a tax of Twenty five cents upon each One Hundred Dollars taxable valuation of property within Common School District No 20.

of Titus County Texas. From said tax there shall be created a sinking fund with which to pay the principal of said bonds at maturity as well as a fund for the payment of the interest. There is now levied for each of the years while said bonds or any part thereof are outstanding and unpaid, the said tax or a sufficient amount thereof to provide for the interest on said bonds as it accrues and to create a sinking fund with which to pay the principal thereof at maturity.

It is further ordered that S. F. Caldwell attorney for said district have charge of the matter of presenting the said bonds to the Attorney General of the State of Texas for certification as the law requires and to present said bonds to the State Comptroller for registration as the law requires and to receive said bonds from the Comptroller when registered for said district.

The County Judge put the motion for the vote of the members of the Commissioners of Titus County Texas with the request that as many of them as favored the motion to vote. Aye. Whereupon County Commissioners Seward King Sims and Thomas voted Aye - None voted No. The County Judge declared the motion carried and the Order passed.
