On this day came on to be considered the matter of the petition of J. M. Allen and others for forming voters of Common School district no. 20 of This County, Texas, praying that an election be ordered held in said district for the purpose of submitting to the property tax paying voters of said district the question of the abrogation of the special tax now being levied in said district - It appearing that said petition is in proper form and that there has been no election held in said district in two years prior to this time on the question of a special tax and that said petition is signed by at least 20 resident property tax paying voters of said district.

It is, therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed that an election be held in said district at the school house therein on the 15th day of July 1916 for the purpose of submitting to the property tax paying voters of said district the question of abrogating the special tax heretofore authorized and now being levied in said district.

In the matter of Election Returns C.S. No. 34 for special maintenance Tax } June 21st 1916

On this day came on to be considered the returns of election held on the 17th day of June 1916 to decide whether or not a tax not to exceed 50 cents on the \$100 taxable valuation of property and other compulsory good returns it was found by the court that there were cast "For the tax" 13 votes and "Against the tax" 2 votes. It is therefore ordered and declared that for the tax assessed and said tax is ordered levied assessed and collected in said C.S. No. 34.

In the matter of Election Returns }
