

Aug Term Aug. 14 - 1916

Be it Remembered that on Monday  
the 14<sup>th</sup> day of August 1916 there was  
held a regular term of the Courthouse  
Court. T. H. County, The Hon. Sam Porter  
County Judge, A. P. Amos, W. M. King,  
E. C. Sinton, S. Thomas, Commissioner  
& A. C. Cospay Sheriff, W. R. Kelly Clerk  
where the following proceedings  
were had to-wit:

In the matter of the Petition  
of C. Ferguson et al for Aug. 14<sup>th</sup> 1916  
Change in Public Road

On this day came  
on to be heard the Petition of C. Ferguson  
et al for change in the Glad Hill and  
Spodewater Public Road and after  
hearing the Petitioners Counsel as of the same  
day a said Road should be changed and  
the same is ordered by said Court as  
follows: Beginning of Chief Ferguson  
house running South by E. G. Davis  
thence west on land line between  
said Ferguson and E. G. Davis's farms  
thence South between A. Haas and  
Chief Ferguson thence in a South  
western direction through a part of A.  
Hall's land and to continue in the same  
direction through Tom Gloss's farm  
thence to the Snow Hill Road said Road  
to intercept the said Snow Hill Road at  
or about the Green Hill Church. Balance  
of said Road to be made a Public Highway  
as follows. Beginning of Chief Ferguson  
running west to Jim Newson's and  
intercept the said Blocks Bridge Road.

In the matter of Election Returns held Aug 5-1916 } Aug 14-1916  
C.S. dist No 21. Mendocino Tex }

On this day come on to be considered the returns of an election held Aug 5<sup>th</sup> 1916 to decide whether or not a maintenance to or not to exceed 50 cents on the \$100<sup>00</sup> valuation of taxable property in Common School District No. 21, and after considering said returns, it is found by the court that there were cast "For the tax" 16 votes and "Against the tax" 14 votes. It is therefore ordered by the court that "For the tax" carried and it is further ordered that a tax for maintenance be levied assessed and collected in Common School District No 21, not to exceed 50 cents on the \$100<sup>00</sup> valuation of taxable property in said Common School District.

In the matter of the Petition of W.E. Welborn et al for } Aug 14-1916  
Public Highway }

On this day come on to be considered the Petition of W.E. Welborn et al for Public Highway and after hearing the Petition and the petitioners. The Court is of the opinion that said Petition shows and the same is hereby granted. To wit:

Beginning of a point about 2 miles east of Coakville on the Coakville and Conroy public Road where the land lines of W.E. Welborn and W.H. Threlkeld intersect said road and thence south with said lines and running with the land lines of W.M. Long and Mrs M.E. Ford south to Coakville and along road about

two and one half miles South East of Cook-  
ville, said road being 7/8 of a mile long

In the matter of Petition of  
W. Bennett & others who changed & Aug 14-1916  
Public Road of Wurfel

On this day  
came on to be considered the Petition  
of W. Bennett and 19 others and after hearing  
said Petition and Petitioners etc. came to  
of the opinion that said petition should  
be granted the same is hereby granted. To wit:

Beginning at a point about 1/2 mile  
East of Wurfel at a point known as the  
Bankster corner of the junction of a sur-  
face road leading south of the road that  
thence north west across the M. Barred place  
to a point directly east of a line with the  
first street running Cook and West in Wurfel  
thence west to  
the east end of said street and connecting  
thence, thence west with some to second  
street, thence north with Cleveland street to a  
stake 135 feet north of the St. Louis Southern  
Railroad, thence west 300 feet to Miller street  
thence south with Miller street to the second street  
running east & west - thence west with said st.  
to Lincoln street to the intersection of the present lo-  
cation of the Mt. Pleasant and Sulphur Springs road

of the said Commissioners Court do  
hereby recommend to the City of Mt Pleasant  
that the City Council, use the said Ada  
Oklahoma Book Spalte, for paving to be  
laid on Jefferson Street inasmuch as  
we are to bear a portion of the cost of said  
paving.

In the matter of building a Jail  
Tulsa County, 1916

On this day  
Came on before the Commissioners  
Court of Tulsa Co 1916. The proposition  
of erecting & equipping a new jail for  
Tulsa County. And after dis-  
cussion and consideration same  
Com. E. C. Sims made the motion  
that a new properly equipped jail be  
built. The motion was seconded by  
S. A. Thomas, after which Sarge Porter  
County Judge of Tulsa Co. put the  
motion. Commissioners E. C.  
Sims, S. A. Thomas, W. M. King and  
A. P. Smart voted "aye" none  
voted "no"

It is therefore ordered and decided by  
by the Commissioners Court that  
a jail properly equipped in modern  
style be built in Tulsa County, 1916  
and that August 28<sup>th</sup> 1916 be  
set to examine plans & specifications  
of said jail building.
