

Be it remembered, that the Commissioners Court of Tarrant County Texas, met in a regular session on the 14th day of October, A.D. 1916 at the Court House of said County, in the City of Ft. Worth, Texas, with the following members present, to-wit:-

Sam Porter County Judge

A. P. Smart County Commissioner for Commissioners Precinct No. 1.

S. A. Thomas County Commissioner for Commissioners Precinct No. 2.

H. M. King County Commissioner for Commissioners Precinct No. 3.

E. C. Sims, County Commissioner for Commissioners Precinct No. 4.

H. L. Kelley County Clerk for Tarrant County Texas.

Court having been duly opened, as the law provides, the matter of considering bids for the building of a jail for Tarrant County Texas, came on to be considered. All bids filed with the Court were opened and carefully considered.

Whereupon County Commissioner E. C. Sims offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Tarrant County Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by the Court, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner H. M. King. The order is as follows, to-wit:-

"Whereas, the Commissioners Court of Tarrant County Texas have heretofore, by order duly passed, determined that it is necessary to construct a new jail for Tarrant County Texas and invited bids for the construction of such building to be filed at this time for the consideration of the court.

And, whereas, bids have been filed. All of such bids having been opened and considered it is the opinion of the Court that the bid filed by the Parley Jail Building Company by its agent S. R. Cloud with the agreement of the bidder through its said agent in open Court, that the special steel used by the bidder in the construction of jails, be used in the construction.

of the part of such building where prisoners
are to be confined: is the best bid filed and
made to this County.

Such bid being in words and figures as
follows to wit: -

I or we propose to furnish all material,
labor, and erect complete as per plans and
specifications, all work to be done in connection
with the jail and jailers residence, at Mt.

Pleasant Texas for the sum of Twenty-two

Thousand nine Hundred Eighty-five Dollars

W \$22,985.00 for furnishing all work and materi-
al for the complete construction of jail cells
and corridors together with other iron work,
according to plans and specifications complete
for the sum of Eight Hundred Two Hundred
Eighty Seven Dollars \$8,287.00

For furnishing all labor material and
erecting complete as per plans and specifications
jailers residence and jail building for the
sum of

For alternate Third Story Floor and furnishing
additional steel for floors for the sum of Two
Hundred and Eighteen $7\frac{70}{100}$ Dollars \$218.70

For lining inside of Criminal Cell Room and
Corridor with $\frac{3}{16}$ " Steel Plate anchored to walls.

This plate to be 8' high. For the sum of One
Thousand Eighty Six Dollars \$1,086.00. Payable in
Titus County $\frac{6}{100}$ interest bearing warrants.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed
by the Commissioners Court of Titus County
Texas, that said bid and offer in words and
figures as follows to wit: - I or we propose to
furnish all material and labor and erect
complete as per plans and specifications

All work to be done in connection with jail and jailers residence at Mt. Pleasant, Texas for the sum of Twenty Two Thousand Five Hundred and Eighty Five Dollars \$22,985.00, which shall include bidders agreement to use its special "Steel in jail" which is payable in deferred payments to be evidenced by the warrants of the County bearing interest as the bid indicates, be and the same is now accepted. All other bids rejected. That said amount be payable in annual installments as follows to-wit:-

\$3,000.00 shall be due and payable March 1st, 1918

\$3,000.00 shall be due and payable March 1st, 1919

\$2,985.00 shall be due and payable March 1st, 1920

\$2,000.00 shall be due and payable March 1st, 1921

\$2,000.00 shall be due and payable March 1st, 1922

\$2,000.00 shall be due and payable March 1st, 1923

\$2,000.00 shall be due and payable March 1st, 1924

\$2,000.00 shall be due and payable March 1st, 1925

\$2,000.00 shall be due and payable March 1st, 1926

Said amount of \$22,985.00, which is the debt of the County, on account of said bid and its acceptance, shall be evidenced by the warrants of Tarrant County, Texas, which shall be called "Tarrant County Jail Warrants Series October 4th 1916", which shall be in denominations of \$500.00 each, except No. 46, which shall be for the sum of \$485.00, they shall be numbered from 1 to 46, both inclusive; shall be payable to the Pauly Jail Building Company or bearer, at the office of the County Treasurer of Tarrant County, Texas; shall state that they are issued for the purpose of evidencing the debt of Tarrant County, Texas, due to the Pauly Jail Building Company for labor and material furnished to it in the construction of a jail building and equipping it with a jail under the terms of the bid made by the Pauly Jail Building Company, the order of the Commissioners Court of said

County accepting it and the contract between
 said parties the warrants shall be dated
 Oct 14 1916 and shall bear interest from date of
 the rate of 6% per annum until paid payable
 semi-annually on April 15 and October 15
 each year, which interest shall be evidenced
 by interest coupon warrants which shall be
 attached to each of the principal warrants and
 which are made an essential part of the
 principal warrants on the debt represented
 and intended by them provided that the
 interest that shall have accrued to the
 extent of the amount of such warrants
 shall be credited on the face of the first
 interest coupon attached to the same said
 principal warrants shall be an out-
 standingly the year ending year, 1916-17-

 No 16, which is for the sum of four hundred
 eighty five and 2/100 Dollars, issued by the
 County Clerk of the County of Linn, Iowa, Building Company

for the purpose of evidencing the debt of the County due to it under the terms of its bid to the County as made on the 14th day of October A.D. 1916, the order of the Commissioners Court of said County accepting said bid and the contract between them of date October 21st 1916 for labor and material furnished to said County in the reconstruction of a jail for said County. Accounts of the Pauley Jail Building Company for labor and material furnished to said County in the construction of the jail, which have been approved by the Architect, have been presented to the Commissioners Court of said County and by said Court have been so examined, audited and allowed as required by law and this and the other warrants of this series have been ordered by said Court issued and delivered to the Pauley Jail Building Company to evidence said debt as the orders of this Court legally passed and entered of record in its minutes provide.

It is recited and certified that the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas, did at a regular meeting thereof, on the 14th day of October A.D. 1916 create a special fund for Titus County Texas, designated as "Titus County Jail Warrants Series October 14th 1916" for the purpose of paying this and the other warrants including the Interest Coupon Warrants hereto attached, and ordered a tax levied against all taxable property in said County of a rate sufficient to pay the interest as it accrues on said warrants and the principal as it matures, which tax was also ordered assessed and collected and placed to the credit of said special fund and used exclusively for the purpose of paying this and the other warrants of its series including the interest Coupon Warrants attached to each of them, which said order was passed when each and every member of said Court was present and is now of record in the minutes

of said Court.

That there is now created a special fund designated "Titus County Jail Warrants Series Oct 14th 1916" for the purpose of paying the principal and interest on said warrants as it shall mature. There is now appropriated from the taxes levied for said County for the year 1916 the sum of six thousand Eighty Nine & 55/100 Dollars for the purpose of paying the interest on said principal warrants as evidenced by the interest coupon warrants attached to them maturing April 14th 1917 which sum when collected shall be placed to the credit of said special fund and appropriated exclusively to the payment of said interest coupon warrants. There is now levied for the year 1917, and each year thereafter while said warrants are outstanding and unpaid a tax of ten cents upon each and every One Hundred Dollars taxable valuation of property within Titus County Texas, which tax shall be assessed and collected and placed to the credit of said special fund and used exclusively for the purpose of paying said warrants as they shall mature. Should said rate of tax become insufficient for any of said years to produce the necessary sum of money to pay the said warrants which shall from time to time mature the Commissioners Court now obligated itself to increase said rate to such a rate as will be sufficient to raise the sum of money that will pay such warrants as they shall mature.

The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No".

Whereupon County Commissioners, A. P. Smart, S. G. Thomas, H. M. King, and E. C. Sims voted "Aye". None voted "No". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

The foregoing minutes of the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas, containing the proceedings concerning the acceptance of the bid of Pauly Jail Building Company, read and approved by me on this the 14th day of October, A. D. 1916
