Be it remembered that on the 11<sup>th</sup> 1916  
there was begun and holden a regular term  
of the Hon. Commissioners Court of Titus County  
was with the following officers present to wit:  
Hon J.W. Table, Judge, R.P. Smart Com. King, J.W. Edwards  
C.G. Barnes Com. C.J. Neugent Recy. J.W. Booth Sheriff  
where the following proceedings were had  
to wit:

On the matter of approving various  
officers official Bonds elected <sup>E</sup> Dec 11<sup>th</sup> 1916  
at the General election in Nov. 1916 <sup>?</sup>

On this day cause are to be considered the  
Official Bonds of various County and Precinct officers  
and after examining all of said Bonds and finding  
them to be good and sufficient Bonds,  
the Court approved the Bonds of the following officers  
to wit: Allie Glover E. Morgan J.M. Thurman  
Sam Smith J.H. Cargile O.P. Neal H.M. Clark

On this day cause are to be considered by the  
Court the final report of Mrs. Ann Price Tax Collector  
and after examining said report find same  
to be correct.

December 11<sup>th</sup> 1917

On this day Harry Madden presented to  
the Court his resignation as Constable of Precinct  
No 8 of Titus Co. and after being duly considered  
by the Court, the Court accepted said resignation.

On this the 11<sup>th</sup> day of Dec. 1917 it is ordered by the Com.  
Court of Titus County Texas, that Jeff Table County Judge of said Co.  
be authorized & have full authority to order the County Clerk of said Co.  
to issue warrants against the various funds of Titus Co. Where said Com.  
Court is not in Session or in vacation. Said warrants to be issued  
to pay for persons & parties who are in the opinion of said Judge in need  
of help to sustain life and further to pay debts against said Co. Where in  
the opinion of the said Co. Judge it is not to the best interest of said Co.  
said debts until the regular terms of said Com. Court for payment.

Be it remembered that the Commissioners  
of County of Sibley County Texas and in a regular  
order of session at the County Hall of said County  
Commissioners in the City of Mt Pleasant Texas on the 11<sup>th</sup> day  
and preceding December A D 1916 with the following members  
present to wit:-

No 1- W. L. Webb - County Judge and County  
Commissioners, several King, Holman and  
School Dist. Trustees and County Clerk C. H. Neugens

No 2- Court was opened by proclamations  
of the Sheriff of Sibley County Texas.

County Commissioner King offered the  
following Order to the Commissioners Court  
of Sibley County Texas and made a motion  
that the same be passed by the <sup>said</sup> Court, which  
motion was seconded by County Commissioner  
King. The Order is as follows to wit:-

"It appearing to the Commissioners Court  
of Sibley County Texas that an election was  
held in Common School District No 13 of  
Sibley County Texas, on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of November  
1916, as had been theretofore ordered  
by the County Judge of Sibley County Texas.  
at which the following proposition to vote  
"The issuance of the coupon bonds of  
said District to the amount of fifteen  
hundred Dollars, to draw five per cent  
interest from date until paid, payable  
annually, to become due and payable  
twenty years after date with the option  
to redeem them at any time after one  
year from date for the purpose of construct-  
ing and equipping a public School  
Building within said district, and the laying  
assessment and collection of  
an annual tax against all taxable proper-  
ty within said district of a rate sufficient  
to pay the interest on said bonds with  
accrues, and to create a sinking fund  
with which to pay the principal thereof  
at maturity" was submitted to the tax-

paying voters of said district.

It further appearing from the returns of said election which are in proper form, that there were cast at said election 11 votes and that there were cast for the Bonds 11 votes and that no votes were cast against the Bonds and that said election resulted in a majority of the votes cast at said election being cast in favor of the Bonds and Bonds and the Levy of the tax.

It is therefore ordered adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas that said election resulted in favor of the issuance of the said Bonds and the Levy of the tax.

The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of Commissioners of Titus County Texas with the request that all may be favored the motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No". Thereupon County Commissioners Smart King Holmes and Edwards voted "Aye" Novel voted "No". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

Court sitting in session on the same day, December 11<sup>th</sup> 1916, County Commissioners Smart offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas under seal as motion that the same be passed by the Court, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner King. The order is as follows to-wit:-

It appearing to the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas, that an election was held in November school District 13 of Titus County Texas on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of November 1916, on the question of the issuance of the Coupon Bonds of said district to the amount of Fifteen Hundred Dollars, bearing interest from date at the rate of five per cent until paid, payable annually, to become due and payable 20 years after date with the option

to redeem them at any time after one year from date for the purpose of constructing and equipping a public free school building within said district and the sum, assessment and collection of one annual tax against all taxable property of said district at a rate sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it matures and to create a sinking fund with which to pay the principal thereof at maturity and that a majority of the voter cast at the said election were cast in favor of the bonds and that

It is therefore ordered that the Board of Common Schools District No 13 of Titus County Texas, to be called "School House Bonds Board of Common Schools District No 13 of Titus County Texas, Series February 10th 1917," shall be issued to the amount of fifteen Hundred Dollars to become due and payable 20 years after date with the option to redeem them at any time after one year from date to draw interest at the rate of 5% per annum from date until paid payable annually on the 10th day of February each year for the purpose of constructing and equipping a public free school building within said district, that such Bonds shall be numbered from 1 to 10, both inclusive, shall be payable at the office of the County Depository of Titus County Texas or the Office of the Treasurer of the State of Texas or at Hanover National Bank, New-York City N.Y. at the option of the Holders which shall be in denominations of \$100<sup>00</sup> each and shall be signed by the County Judge and County Clerk of Titus County Texas. The interest on said Bonds shall be evidenced by interest coupons attached to each of said Bonds which shall be payable at the same places as the same principal which may be signed together written printed or

or little graphed signatures of the County Judge and County Clerk of Titus County Texas. The Bonds shall bear the seal of the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas impresead upon each of them.

It is further ordered that a tax of 11 cents upon each and every one hundred Dollars of valuation of taxable property in Common Schools District No 13 of Titus County Texas be now levied for the years 1911 and each year thereafter while said Bonds are outstanding, interest excepted, which shall be assessed and collected and appropriated exclusively to the payment of the interest and principal of said Bonds.

It is further ordered that S. L. T. Caldwell, attorney for said district have charge of the recorder of said Bonds and that he be authorized to present the same to the Attorney General of Texas for examination and the bonds for certification and registration.

The County Judge put the motions with the request that a majority of the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas favored the motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No". County Commissioners Smart King Holmes and Edwards voted "Aye" None voted "No" the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

The foregoing minutes of the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas of December 11th 1910 continuing the proceedings of said Court, canvassing and declaring the results of the elections in common schools District No 13 of Titus County Texas providing for the issuance of the school bonds of the said district, and the levy of at least to pay the principal and interest thereof and approved by me on this the 11th

day of December 1916
