Be it remembered that on this the 24th day of March 1917, a Special Session of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, held for the purpose of opening the polls and canvassing the returns of an election held in and for the County of Titus and State of Texas on the 17th day of March 1917, to determine whether or not the County would take up the work of Tick Eradication, and said Court proceeded to open the polls and canvass the returns of the votes cast at said election and it appearing to the Court that at said election 577 votes were cast for Tick Eradication and that 523 votes were cast against Tick Eradication and that at said election 54 more votes cast for Tick Eradication than were cast against it.

It is therefore hereby ordered and declared that Titus County will take up the work of Tick Eradication in the manner prescribed by law until at such time as the qualified voters of said County, may at a legal election held for that purpose by a majority vote declare otherwise.

Dable, County Judge of Titus County, Texas, having selected the Weekly Journal newspaper published in Titus County, to publish the order passed by the County Commissioners Court of Titus Co.
