

Be it remembered that the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, met in regular session thereof at the Court House of said County in the City of Mt Pleasant, Texas, on the 9th day of April 1917 with the following members present, to wit: J. W. Fable, County Judge, County Commissioners, Smart, Helms, King and Edwards, and County Clerk, C. Neigunt. Court was opened by proclamation of the Sheriff of Titus County, Texas.

County Commissioner, A. P. Smart, offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by said Court which motion was seconded by County Commissioner W. M. King. The order is as follows, to wit:

It appearing to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that said County and the Pearly Jail Building Company entered into a contract by the terms of which a new jail for said County was to be constructed on the 14th day of October A. D. 1916, and that so much of said contract and the orders of this Court as fixes the form, number and denomination of the warrants and the dates for paying interest should now be amended and hereinafter ordered for the purpose of serving the convenience of both parties under the facts.

It further appearing to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that the Pearly Jail Building Company, as said contract provides have furnished a part of the material for the building of the jail for Titus County, and that the architect, H. B. Wilder, has made and filed an estimate for such labor and material with this Court, which in words and figures is as follows, to wit:

The Pearly Jail Building Company

For labor and material furnished in the construction of the new jail for Titus County Texas under the terms of the Contract of date October 14th 1916, up to this date \$5,000.00

Less 20% retained as the contract provides \$1,000.00

Total amount due now \$4,000.00

It appearing to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that such estimate is true and correct and now due to the Pauly Jail Building Company. It also appears that Titus County, Texas has in fact received such labor and material and that the same is in strict compliance with the contract between them.

It is therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas that said estimate for labor and material furnished to Titus County, Texas, by the Pauly Jail Building Company, which is for the sum of Four Thousand Dollars be now in all things approved, allowed and ordered paid to the Pauly Jail Building Company as the contract between it and Titus County, Texas, of date October 14th 1916 provides that the principal Warrants of Titus County, Texas, numbered from one to four both inclusive in denominations of \$1,000.00 each designated "Titus County Jail Warrants, Series October 14th 1916, bearing interest at the rate of 6% per annum from this date which is evidenced by interest coupon warrants attached to each of such principal warrants, and payable to the Pauly Jail Building Company or bearer, be now issued and delivered to the Pauly Jail Building Company to evidence the debt of Titus County, Texas to it for such labor and material as said contract provides.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court that Warrants provided

from by the terms of the said contract of date Oct. 14th 1916, be now changed so that hereafter they will be numbered from one to twenty three, both inclusive; in denominations of one thousand dollars each, except no. 9 which is for the sum of nine hundred eighty five dollars and will state that the interest on them will be payable on march 1st and september 1st each year. They shall be in substantially the following form, to wit:

Titus County Jail Warrants, Series October 14th 1916.

The County Treasurer of Titus County, Texas, will pay to the Pauly Jail Building Company, or bearer, on the 1st day of march 19__ at the office of the County Treasurer of Titus County Texas, in the City of Mt. Pleasant, Texas or at Hanover National Bank, New York City, N.Y., at the option of the holder, the sum of One thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States of America together with interest at the rate of 6% per annum from date until paid, payable semi-annually on march 1st and September 1st of each year at the same places as the principal which interest shall be evidenced by interest Coupon Warrants attached hereto, both principal and interest payable from the special fund of the County designated "Titus County Jail Warrants, Series October 14th 1916", created for the purpose by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas.

This is one of a series of warrants numbered from 1 to 23, both inclusive, in denominations of one thousand dollars each, except number 9 which is for the sum of nine hundred and eighty five dollars, issued by Titus County, Texas, to the Pauly Jail Building Company,

for the purpose of evidencing the debt of the County due to it under the terms of its bid to the County on the 14th day of October A.D. 1916, the order of the Commissioners Court of said County accepting said bid and the Contract between them of date October 21st 1916 for labor and material furnished in the construction of a jail for said County.

Accounts of the Pauley Jail Building Company for labor and material furnished to said County in the construction of the jail which have been approved by the architect have been presented to the Commissioners Court of said County and by said Court have been examined, audited and allowed as required by law; and this and the other warrants of this series have been ordered, by said Court, issued and delivered to the Pauley Jail Building Company to evidence said debt, as the orders of the Court legally passed and entered of record interminutely provide.

It is recited and certified that The Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas did at a regular session thereof, on the 14th day of October A.D. 1916, create a special fund for "Titus County, Texas, designated as "Titus County Jail Warrants, Series October 14th 1916" for the purpose of paying this and the other warrants of this series including the interest coupon warrants hereto attached and ordered a tax levied against all taxable property in said County of a rate sufficient to pay the interest as it accrues on said warrants and the principal as it matures, which tax was also ordered assessed and collected and placed to the credit of said special fund and used exclusively for the purpose of paying this and the other warrants of its series including the interest coupon warrants attached to each of them, which order was passed when each and every member

of said Court was present and is now of record in the minutes of said Court.

Witness our hands this the 14th day of October A. D. 1916 the date of this Warrant as fixed by said order, and the Seal of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas.

The form of the interest Coupon Warrants shall remain the same as fixed except that the appropriate amounts shall be shown in each.

The principal Warrants as above provided shall be payable as follows, to wit:

Nos 1 to 3 for \$1000⁰⁰ each due and payable March 1st 1918.

Nos 4 to 6 for \$1000⁰⁰ each due and payable March 1st 1919.

Nos 7 to 9 for \$1000⁰⁰ each except no 9 which is for \$985.00 due and payable March 1st 1920.

Nos 10 to 11 for \$1000⁰⁰ each due and payable March 1st 1921.

Nos 12 to 13 for \$1000⁰⁰ each due and payable March 1st 1922.

Nos 14 to 15 for \$1000⁰⁰ each due and payable March 1st 1923.

Nos 16 to 17 for \$1000⁰⁰ each due and payable March 1st 1924.

Nos 18 to 19 for \$1000⁰⁰ each due and payable March 1st 1925.

Nos 20 to 21 for \$1000⁰⁰ each due and payable March 1st 1926.

Nos 22 to 23 for \$1000⁰⁰ each due and payable March 1st 1927.

The Warrants shall bear interest at the rate of 6% per annum according to the terms of the contract and shall be payable semi-annually on March 1st and September 1st each year.

All orders heretofore passed as now changed hereby concerning such contract are

in all things ratified and confirmed;

The County Judge put the motion to a vote of the members of the Commissioners Court of said County with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "No". County Commissioners, Smart, King, Holmes and Edwards voted "aye" none voted "No".

The County Judge declared the motion carried and the passed.

 thence west with the S.B. line by the Joseph Reed
 survey to the Franklin County line.

It is ordered, adjudged and decreed
 by the court that said above described road
 be and the same is hereby made a
 public road.
