

November Special Term 1917

Be it remembered that on this the 24th day of November A.D. 1917 the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas met in Special Session with the following members present, to wit: J.W. Gable County Judge, A.P. Smart, B.G. Holmes, Com. and J.W. Edwards, Commissioners, and C. Neugart, Clerk when the following proceedings were had to wit:

Resignation of B.G. Holmes 3
 Commissioner of Precinct #1 3
 Nov. 24, 1917

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas the resignation of B.G. Holmes Commissioner of Precinct #1 of Titus County, Texas, and after due consideration the County Commissioners Smart made a motion that the Court accept said resignation, and being seconded by Commissioner Edwards, the County Judge requested that as many of the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas that favored accepting said resignation to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no" All of the members voted "aye."

It is ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas that the said resignation of B.G. Holmes as Com. of Precinct #1 of Titus County Texas be in all things accepted.

Application of E.C. Bryant 3
 to be appointed Commissioner 3
 Nov. 24, 1917

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas the application of E.C. Bryant asking that he be appointed Commissioner of Precinct #2 of Titus County, Texas, and after due consideration of said application, Commissioner Smart made a motion that be seconded by Com. Edwards that said E.C. Bryant be appointed Commissioner of Precinct No. 2 of Titus County Texas to fill out the unexpired term of B.G. Holmes.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed

by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas,
that E. C. Bryant be in all things appointed
Commissioner of Precinct # 2 of Titus County Texas,

Be it remembered that the Commissioners
Court of Titus County Texas, met in a Special Session
thereof at the Court House of said County in the
City of Mt. Pleasant, Texas, on the 24th day of Nov. 1917,
with the following members present to wit;
J. W. Tabb, County Judge, A. C. Smart, County Commissioner
Precinct # 1, E. C. Bryant, County Commissioner Precinct # 2,
W. M. King, County Commissioner Precinct # 3, J. W. Edwards,
County Commissioner Precinct # 4, C. Neugent County Clerk.

The Court took up for consideration the matter
of the sale of the Road Bonds of Road District
number four of Titus County, Texas, to the amount
of \$20,000.00, whereupon County Commissioner Smart
offered the following order to the Commissioners
Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion
that the same be passed by the Court, which
motion was seconded by County Commissioner
Edwards. The order is as follows, to wit:

It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus
County, Texas, that for the \$20,000.00 Road Bonds
of Road District number four of Titus County,
Texas, as fully described in the order of this
Court, of date November 10th 1917, providing for
their issuance, Messrs. Smith Bros. have made
their offer to the Court in words and
figures as follows, to wit:

To the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas
We offer you for your Road Bonds of Road
District number four of Titus County, Texas,
to the amount of Twenty thousand Dollars bearing
interest from date until paid at the rate of 5%
per annum payable semi-annually as
fully described in your order providing for
their issuance of date November 10th 1917, their
face value and accrued interest
Smith Bros.
G. H. Smith

It further appears that the foregoing offer is the only offer made for said lands and that it is in all respects legal.

It is, therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that the foregoing offer of Smith Brothers for the \$20,000⁰⁰ Road Bonds of Road District number four of Titus County, Texas, be in all things accepted and that said lands be delivered to Smith Brothers upon the payment of their par value and accrued interest.

The County Judge of Titus County, Texas, put the said motion for a vote of the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "aye," and those opposed to vote "no." County Commissioner, Smart, Bryant King and Edwards, voted "aye" none voted "no."

The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

The foregoing minutes of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, read and in all things approved this the 20th day of Nov. 1917

It is ordered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that Seb F. Caldwell be paid from the funds of Road District number four of Titus County, Texas, the sum of \$100⁰⁰ attorneys fees for services rendered the district in matter of the land election.

And that H. S. Wilder be allowed from the same funds the sum of \$500⁰⁰ as partial payment for engineering services for said district. Voted for by each and all members of the Court
