

Whereas the returns of an election held within Justice Precinct number three of Titus County, Texas, on the question of whether hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large in said justice precinct held on the 22nd day of June A. D. 1918 have been made by the elections officers who held said election.

And whereas it being made by law my duty to canvass said election returns in the presence of a Justice of the Peace of Titus County Texas, and the County Clerk of Titus County Texas, and whereas I have opened and canvassed said election returns in the presence of C. Mergent County Clerk of Titus County Texas, and L. B. Roach a Justice of the Peace for said County, and from said canvass and count of the votes shown to have been cast at said election. It appears that there were cast at said election 105 votes, that there were cast at said election for the stock law 46 votes and there were cast at said election against the stock law 59 votes. It further appears from said election returns that a majority of the votes cast at said election were cast against the stock law.

It is, therefore, ordered, adjudged, decreed and declared that a majority of the votes cast at said election were cast against the stock law and I now proclaim that said election resulted in the majority of the votes cast thereat being cast against the stock law.

Given under my hand and the seal of my office at Mt. Pleasant, Texas, this the 1st day of July A. D. 1918.

Whereas, the returns of an election held in Justice Precinct no. 2, of Titus County Texas, on the questions of whether horses, mules, jacks, ferrets and cattle shall be permitted to run at large in said justice precinct held on June 22nd ad. 1918, have been made by the election officers, who held said election.

And, whereas, it is made my duty, by law to canvass and declare the results of said election in the presence of a Justice of the Peace of said County and the County Clerk of said County.

And, whereas, on July 1st 1918, in the presence of C. Neugent, County Clerk of Titus County Texas, and L. B. Roach, Justice of the Peace of Precinct number one of Titus County Texas, I did open, canvass and count said election returns and it appears therefrom that there were cast at said election 72 votes that there were cast for the stock law 43 votes and that there were cast at said election against the stock law 29 votes and that a majority of the votes cast at said election were cast in favor of the stock law.

Now, therefore, I order, decree, adjudge and declare that said election resulted in favor of the stock law and I now proclaim that said election resulted in favor of the stock law in said justice precinct and that such law will take effect in the manner and time provided by law.
