P. Smart, W. M. King, E. C. Bryant and J. F. Cameron Commissioners, C. Merigant Clerk and W. W. Smith Sheriff. Court was opened by a proclamation of the Sheriff of Titus County Texas.

On this day it is ordered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas that the Election managers and Clerks be allowed the fees as required by law who held the Hospital Band Election in Titus County as follows; Managers, W. Blankenship, M. C. Haggard, Geo. Grissam and Jack Harris be allowed the sum of \$2.00 each to be paid out of the Gen. Co. fund.

July 13th, 1918

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas the matter of allowing Seb F. Caldwell a fee for his services in promoting the bond issue of Road District # 5 of Titus County, Texas. County Commissioner King made a motion which was seconded by Suddit that Seb F. Caldwell be allowed the sum of \$150.00 for his legal services in promoting the bond issue of Road Dist. # 5 of Titus Co. Texas. The County Judge of Titus County, Texas presiding put the motion and requested the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County that favored the motion to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no". All members of the Court voted "aye". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

On this day the Commissioners Court of Titus County allowed the Managers and Clerks holding the stock law election in Precinct # 2 of Titus County Texas the legal fees as follows: W. A. Matton mgr. \$4.00 J. W. Floyd \$2.00 and R. W. McCallen \$2.00. Said amounts to be paid out of the Gen. Co. Fund of Titus Co. Tex.

Whereas the petitions of M. H. May and 26 other resident property taxpaying voters of Common School District Number Eight of Titus County Texas, praying for and election to be ordered held within said district for the purpose of submitting to the resident property taxpaying voters of such district the question of levying, assessing and collecting a special tax against all taxable property within said district of a rate not to exceed fifty cents upon each and every one hundred dollars valuation thereof for the purpose of supplementing the State school fund, apportioned to said district, has been presented to me

It appears that such petition is signed by as many as twenty resident property taxpaying voters of said district, that it is in proper form and should be granted

Now, therefore, I, J. W. Tabb, County Judge for Titus County, Texas, order an election to be held within said district at the school house therein, on the 24th day of August A. D. 1918, for the purpose of submitting to the resident property taxpaying voters of Common School District Number Eight of Titus County Texas, the question of the levy, assessment and collection of a special tax against all taxable property within said district of a rate not to exceed fifty cents upon each and every one hundred dollars valuation thereof, for the purpose of supplementing the State School fund apportioned to said district. H. C. Gandy, F. M. Coker and J. A. Gross are appointed election officers, to hold said election and make returns thereof as required by law.

The Sheriff of Titus County is ordered to give notice of such election by posting his written notice thereof at each of three public places within said district, one of which shall be in the school house door for three weeks prior to said election.

Be it remembered that the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas, met in a special session on the 15th day of July A.D. 1918, at the Court House of Titus County Texas in the office of the County Judge with the following members present to wit:

J.W. Fabb County Judge, presiding County Commissioners Smart, Bryant, King and Cameron and County Clerk C.T. Neugent, Mr. Arthur A. Styles State Reclamation Engineer, was also present.

When came to be considered by the court, the matter of the petition of T.R. McLean et al praying for the establishment of Level Improvement District Number One of Titus County Texas, and after evidence had been heard for and against the creation of such district, County Commissioner King, offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by the court, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner Smart.

The order is as follows to wit:

It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas, that the petition of T.R. McLean et al signed by the owners of a majority of the acreage of the lands described therein, which is hereinafter described, setting forth the necessity for the creation of the Level Improvement district hereinafter described, describing the general nature of the work proposed to be done by such district, setting forth the feasibility thereof and stating that the name of the district be Level Improvement District Number One of Titus County Texas, had been filed with the County Judge of Titus County Texas, and that such petition by said County Judge, had been set down for a hearing at Ten o'clock A.M. on July 13th A.D. 1918 at the office of the County Judge of Titus County Texas, in the Court house of said County.

It further appears to this Court that notice of said hearing had been given for the time and in the manner required by law, that said petition had been signed by the owners of a

majority of the acreage described therein and after a hearing of evidence and argument for and against the creation of such district that the proposed improvements are desirable, feasible and practicable and would be a public utility and a public benefit and would be conducive to public health.

It is therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas that Sewer Improvement District Number One of Titus County Texas, be and the same is now created and established, and that it shall contain the territory hereinafter described.

That there be now appointed as district supervisors for such district, Thos R McLean, S. R. Harper and John Blackburn, each of whom are the owners of real property situated within such district, and each of whom will qualify as the law requires. The territory of said district is described as follows to-wit:-

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas that the said Louis E. Lee be and he is hereby appointed Justice of the Peace of Precinct #6 of Titus County, Texas to fill out the unexpired term of J. F. Cooley.
