

Be it remembered that on this the 9th day of September A.D. 1918 there was begun and helden a regular term of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, with the following members present to wit: J.W. Tabb, County Judge, A.P. Smart, W.M. King, J.T. Cameron and C.P. Bryant, County Commissioners, C.T. Neasey, County Clerk and constable Sheriff. When the following proceedings were had to wit:

On the matter of Transferring
fund from Road Dist. #4 to Road
and Bridge fund of Titus Co.

Sept. 9, 1918

On this day it is ordered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that the sum of \$221⁴⁶ be transferred to the Road and Bridge fund of Titus County from the funds of Road District No. 4 of Titus County. It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas that Wexner issue out of the funds of Road Dist. #4 to W.C. Burbank, County Road Sup't.

Be it remembered that the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, met in a regular session on the 9th day of September A.D. 1918, at the Court House of said County, in the city of Mt. Pleasant, Texas, with the following members present to wit:-

J.W. Tabb, County Judge, Smart, Bryant, King and Cameron, County Commissioners of Titus County, Texas. Of Commissioners Precincts Numbers One, Two, Three and Four respectively, and C.T. Neasey, County Clerk.

The Court took up for consideration the matter of the returns of the elections held within Common School District Number Six of Titus County, Texas, on the 31st day of August A.D. 1918. Whereupon County Commissioner Cameron, offered the following order, to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas and made a motion that the same be passed by the court, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner Smart. The order is as

followed to wit:-

"It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that, as heretofore ordered by this Court, an election was held in Common School District Number Twenty six of Titus County, Texas on the 31st day of August A.D. 1918, that returns of said election have been made to this Court, as directed by law, and that there were cast at said election 28 votes, that were cast at said election "For the Bonds" 18 votes, that there were cast at said election,

"Against The Bonds" 10 votes, that there were cast at said election "For the Tax" 21 votes and that there were cast at said election "Against the Tax" 6 votes.

It is therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that said election resulted in a majority of the votes cast thereof, being in favor of the issuance of the Coupon Bonds of said district and the levy of a tax against all taxable property within said district as submitted to the resident property taxpaying voters of said district at said election and that said election resulted in favor of a majority of the votes cast thereof, being cast in favor of the levy of the special tax, as submitted in said election to the resident property taxpaying voters of said district, for the purpose of supplementing the State School Fund apportioned to said district, that said Court has power to issue said bonds and to levy said tax.

It is further ordered that said special tax to supplement the State school fund apportioned to said district of and at the rate of twenty five cents upon each and every one hundred dollars valuation of taxable property within said district be levied for the year 1918 and each year thereafter until changed as required by law, which tax is ordered assessed and collected and appropriated to the purposes named."

The County Judge put said motion for a vote of the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas with the request that as many as favored the motion would vote "Aye", and those opposed would vote "No". County Commissioners Smart, Bryant King &

Cameron voted "Aye". None voted "No". County Judge did so and the motion carried and the order passed.

The foregoing minutes of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, read and approved this the 9th day of September A.D. 1918.

Be it remembered that the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, met in a regular session, at the Court House of said County, in the city of Mexia, Texas, on the 9th day of September, A.D. 1918, with the following members present to wit:

J.W. Tabb, County Judge, Smart Bryant King and Cameron, County Commissioners of Titus County, Texas, of Commissioners Precincts Numbers One Two, Three and Four respectively, & C. F. Neugent, County Clerk.

The Court took up for consideration the matter of the issuance of the coupon bonds of Common School District Number Twenty-six of Titus County, Texas.

County Commissioners Cameron offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by the Court, which motion seconded by County Commissioners Smart. The order is as follows, to wit:-

"It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that an election, held within Common School District Number Twenty-six of Titus County, Texas, on the twenty-first day of August, A.D. 1918, a majority of the resident property taxpaying voters of said district, voting at said election, voted in favor of the issuance of the coupon bonds said district to the amount of \$3,000,000 or bearing interest from date at the rate of 6% per annum until paid, payable semiannually to become due, and payable in years after date with the option reserved to the district to redeem and pay off said bonds at any time at one year from date, for the purpose of constructing and equipping a public free school building within said district and purchasing a

site therefore and the levy, assessment and collection
of an annual tax, against all taxable property within
said district, of a rate sufficient to pay the principal
and interest of such bonds as they shall mature,
that the returns of such elections, have been can-
vassed and declared by this Court and that such
bonds right to be issued.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the
Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that the coupon
bonds of Common School District Number 26 of Titus
County, Texas, to be called "School House Bonds of Common
School District Number 26 of Titus County, Texas", be
issued to the amount of Three Thousand Dollars for the
purpose of constructing and equipping a public free
school building within said district and the purpose
of a site therefor, such bonds to be numbered from 1 to 30
both inclusive, in denominations of \$100⁰⁰ each, bear-
ing interest from date at the rate of 6% per annum
until paid, payable semi-annually, on April and October
10th, each year, which interest will be evidenced by inter-
est coupons attached to such bonds, signed by the printed
written or lithographic signatures of the County Judge
and County Clerk of Titus County, Texas, both principal
and interest of such bonds shall be payable, at the
office of the County Treasurer of Titus County, Texas, or at
the office of the State Treasurer of the state of Texas, at the
option of the holder, and such bonds will be dated
Oct. 10th 1918. The bonds will be substantially in the follow-
ing form to wit:

School House Bonds of Common School District

Twenty years after date, for value received, Common
School District No 26 of Titus County Texas, promises
to pay to bearer at the office of the County Treasurer
of Titus County, Texas, at Mt Pleasant, Texas, or at the
office of Treasurer of the State of Texas, at Austin
Texas, the sum of One Hundred Dollars in lawful

money of the United States of America, together with interest thereon from date at the rate of 5% per annum until paid, payable semi-annually on April 1st and October 10th each year, which interest is evidenced by Interest Coupons hereto attached.

This is one of a series of bonds, numbered from 1 to 30, both inclusive, in denominations of \$100.00 each issued by Common School District Number 26 of Titus County, Texas, by virtue of the authority of the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas, an election held within said district on the 31st day of August A.D. 1916, for the purpose whereat a majority of the resident property tax paying voters thereof, voting at said election voted in favor of the issuance of such bonds and the levy of a tax of a rate sufficient to pay the principal and interest thereof as they shall mature, and an order of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas passed and entered in its minutes, for the purpose of constructing and equipping a public free school building within said district, and the purchase of a site therefore. The option to redeem and pay this bond, at any time after one year from date is reserved to said district, and should it elect to exercise such option it will cause notice thereof to be given to the above named places of payment for 30 days prior to that date it will pay such bonds and interest thereon and pay the same and if the holder thereof does not advise the district in time to place the funds necessary to pay said bond aside in the one at which it said place of payment is desired to be made then the bond will cease to bear interest from and after such date.

This is to certify that each and every condition precedent required by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas, to happen and be performed prior to the issuance of such bond has happened and been performed in the time and manner required, and that no limitation of either will be or has been exceeded in the issuance of this bond if any other of its series.

It is further certified that proper provision for the payment of this and such other bonds and the interest

thereon has been made by the levy of a tax against all of taxable property within said district of as rate sufficient to do so.

months interest on Common school District
Number 26 of Titus County Texas, before named
bond, dated October 10th 1918 and uncancelled.

For the purpose of paying the interest on such
bonds as it accrues and to create a sinking fund
with which to pay the principal thereof at maturity
there is now levied for the year 1918 and each and
every year thereafter, while said bonds or any part
thereof are outstanding and unpaid, a tax of and at
the rate of 20¢ upon each and every One Hundred

Dollars valuation of taxable property within said district, which tax is ordered assessed and collected and appropriated to such purpose.

John G. Caldwell is authorized to present such bonds and certified records of the proceedings had concerning them to the Attorney General of Texas for certification as the law requires and to the Comptroller of public accounts of the State of Texas for registration as the law requires and to return such bonds where such purpose have been accomplished to this court.

The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, with the request that as many as favored the motion would vote "Aye" and all those opposed to the motion to vote "No". County Commissioners, Smart, Bryant, King and Cameron, voted "Aye". None voted "No". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.
