

Be it remembered that the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas met in a regular session on the 9th day of May A. D. 1919, at the Court House of said County, in the City of Mt Pleasant, Texas, with the following members present, to wit, J. W. Able, County Judge, Smart, Lee, King and Brown County Commissioners, and C. Neigent, County Clerk. County Commissioner Smart proposed the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by the Court, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner Brown. The order is as follows to wit:

It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas that as directed by this Court the County Judge has caused notice to be given by publication thereof in the weekly Journal, a news paper published in Titus County, Texas for twelve months, that this Court issued on the 9th day of June 1919 receive offers of bids for machinery adequate and sufficient to maintain the Roads of Titus County, Texas, and especially so much thereof as constitute State Highways.

It further appears that the Avery Company of Texas, at Dallas, Texas, has offered to sell the County of Titus the apparatus and machinery for the maintenance of the Public Roads of Titus County, Texas and especially the State Highways within said County, in the items and prices as follows, to wit:

Avery Tractor 25-50 \$3375⁰⁰ F.O.B. Mt. Pleasant,
and that J. D. Adams and Company of Indianapolis, Ind., have submitted its offer to furnish the following items of apparatus and machinery to be used for said purpose the items and prices of which are as follows, to wit:

Giant King grader 10ft. blade \$980⁰⁰

Road maintainer \$370⁰⁰

It further appears to the Court that both offers are fair and reasonable and that the items

of machinery and apparatus are needed by Titus County, Texas, for the purpose of maintaining the Public Roads of said County, and especially the State Highways traversing said County.

It is therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that each of said offers be now in all things accepted and that the County Clerk draw a warrant, as provided by law, upon the funds derived from Automobile taxes now in the Treasury of Titus County, Texas, for the amount of each of said offers payable to each of the makers of said offers for the amount of each for the purpose of paying for said materials and machinery and apparatus.

The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, with the request that as many as favored the motion would vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no". County Commissioner Smart, Lee, King and Brown voted "aye" none voted "no". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

The foregoing minutes of the Commissioners Court read and approved this the 9th day of June A.D. 1919
