

May Term 1919

Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, continuing in regular session May 15th 1919 at Court house of Titus County, with Probable County Judge and County Commissioners Smart, Lee, King and Brown and County Clerk C. Mesquit present,

County Commissioner Smart offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by the Court, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner. See the order is as follows to wit;

It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that is desirable and necessary that this Court procure for Titus County, Texas, machinery engine and apparatus for the purpose of maintaining the public roads in Titus County, Texas, and especially, the National and State Highways traversing Titus County, Texas, which shall be capable and sufficient to drag and keep such roads in condition.

It is therefore, ordered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that the County Judge of Titus County, Texas cause notice to be given, as required by law, that the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, will receive offers for an engine, machinery and apparatus sufficient for maintaining the Public roads of said County, and especially, the State and National Highways traversing said County.

The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas with the request that as many as favored the motion would vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no". County Commissioners, Smart, Lee, King and Brown voted "aye". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, continuing in regular session on May 13th 1919, with all members present.

County Commissioner Brown offered the following order to the County Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by said court, which motion was seconded by Commissioner King.

Whereas, on April 2nd 1919, at a special session of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas it was directed that each County Commissioner of said County employ a suitable man to look after and superintend the matter of cattle dipping in his respective Commissioners Precinct of said County and authorized A. Smart to purchase material necessary for construction of vats and for dipping purposes.

And whereas, Commissioner Brown has employed W. L. Gault to superintend and supervise the dipping of cattle in Commissioners Precinct No. 4 of Titus County, Texas, Commissioner King has employed Tom Beck to superintend the dipping of cattle in Commissioners Precinct No. 3 of Titus County, Commissioner Lee has employed Austin King to superintend the dipping of cattle in Commissioners Precinct No. 2 of Titus County, Texas, and Commissioner Smart has employed Bob Clayton to superintend the dipping of cattle in Commissioners Precinct No. 1 of said County.

And whereas, each of said Commissioners has agreed to pay each of said employes \$100.00 per month for said service.

It is therefore ordered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and that each of said employments be in all things ratified and confirmed and that said salaries be paid on bills presented by said employes as required by law, this

County Judge put the motion for a vote of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no."

County Commissioners, Smart, Lee, King and Brown voted "aye" the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.
