

Be it remembered that the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, met in a regular session at the Court House of said County on the 11th day of August 1919, with the following members present to wit:

Notable County Judge, County Commissioner, Smart, Lee, King and Brown

Court was opened by a proclamation of the Sheriff of Titus County, Texas, County Commissioner Brown offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by the Court, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner Smart. The order is as follows to wit:

It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that Common School District No. 20 of Titus County, Texas, has School House Bond to the amount of \$600⁰⁰ dated April 15th 1916, bearing 5% interest from date, approved by Attorney General of Texas, and registered by Comptroller of Public Accounts for Texas, for sale, said Bond numbered 12 to 16 inclusive for \$100⁰⁰ each. Such bonds are offered to permanent School Fund of Titus County, Texas.

It also appears that Common School District No. 26 of Titus County Texas, has School House bonds approved by Attorney General of Texas, and registered by Comptroller to amount of \$2300⁰⁰ dated Oct. 10th 1919, bearing interest of 5% from date, which is offered to the Permanent School Fund of Titus County, Texas for par and interest.

That the prior right of State Board of Education of Texas, to purchase all of said bonds has been waived.

It is therefore ordered that the permanent School Fund of Titus County, Texas, purchase all of said bonds for par and interest from April 10th 1919 and pay for

Common School District no 20 bond \$611⁰⁰ and for School District no 26 bond \$2344⁰⁰

The Clerk will issue warrants against permanent School fund as indicated. The County Judge put the motion with the request that as many members of said court who favored the motion to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no". County Commissioners, Smart, Lee, King and Brewer Voted "aye".

The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

County Judge, Hobbs, County Commissioners, Smart, Lee, King and Brewer, and County Clerk, O. S. Newcomb.

Court was opened by a proclamation of the Sheriff of Titus County, Texas.

County Commissioner King opened the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner, Smart. The order is as follows:

It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that the petition of Mr. W. A. Fishback and 40 other freeholders of Common School District number one of Titus County, Texas, praying for an election

to be ordered held within said School Dist. in the manner and time provided by law for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters who are freeholders within said district the question of whether hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large within said School District, that said petition is in proper form and should be granted.

It is therefore ordered, and directed, by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that an election be held at the State Bank Building within said district on October 1st, 1919, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters who are freeholders of said district the question of whether hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large within said district. Said School District is described by metes and bounds as shown by the order of this Court creating the same, which order is referred to and made a part of this order for description of said district.

The County Judge of Titus County, Texas, put said motion for a vote of the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, with the request that as many as favored the motion would vote "aye" and all those opposed would vote "no". County Commissioners Smart, Lee, King and Brown voted "aye" none voted "no".

The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

Whereas, the petition of Mr. W.A. Fishback and no other freeholders of Common School District number one of Titus County, Texas, praying for an election to be held within said district for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters, who are freeholders, within said district the question of whether hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large within said district as presented to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, at its August term A.D. 1919, and

Whereas, said Court by its order made and entered upon its minutes on the 11th day of Aug. A.D. 1919, directed that such election be held within said district on the 1st day of Oct. A.D. 1919,

Now therefore, as required and directed by law and in obedience thereto, I, J. G. Stubb, County Judge of Titus County, Texas, order and direct and give notice that an election will be held at the State Bank Building in Tates, Texas, within Common School District number One of Titus County, Texas, on the 1st day of October A.D. 1919 and at such election there shall be submitted to the qualified voters, who are freeholders therein, of Common School District number one of Titus County, Texas, the question of whether hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large within said district. Said district as shown by said petition, is described by metes and bounds as follows, to wit: Beginning at the North East corner of Salaman Tubner Survey on Sulphur River, also north West corner of B. Stunk Survey, thence South to the N.E. line of the F. M. Barnett Survey, thence West to the N.W. corner of the F. M. Barnett Survey; thence South with the E.B. line of T.R. McLean Survey to the N.E. line of the James McCallough Survey; thence East to the N.E. corner of the James McCallough Survey, thence South to the N.W. corner of the Alfred Johnson Survey, thence East to the N.E. corner

of the Alfred Watson survey; Thence South to the S.W. Corner of the A. G. Gray Survey; Thence South to the S.E. Corner of said Watson Survey; Thence West to the E.B. line of the Jas. R. Slaughter Survey; Thence South to the S.W. Corner of the Jas. R. Slaughter Survey; Thence West to the N.E. Corner of the Martina Vega De Gado Survey; Thence South to the N.B. line of the Edward Hobb's Survey; Thence West to the N.W. Corner of said Hobb's Survey; Thence South to White Oak Creek; Thence West with the meanderings of said Creek to the N.B. line of Titus and the E.B. line of Franklin County; Thence North to the N.W. Corner of Titus and N.W. Corner Franklin Counties; Thence East with the meanderings of Sulphur River to the place of figuring Messrs J. H. Blackburn and E. S. Louless, are appointed managers of said election, who will appoint their own Clerks, who are ordered to hold said election and make returns thereof as required by law.

All persons, therefore, will, as required by law, take notice of said election.
