 Court was opened by a proclamation of the Sheriff of Titus County, Texas.

Resignation of Sh. Halcomb } Sept. 8th, 1919
 as Public Weigher }

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County the resignation of Sh. Halcomb as Public Weigher for Precinct # 4 of Titus County, Texas
 The Court after considering said resignation is of the opinion that it should be accepted.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas that the resignation of Sh. Halcomb be in all things accepted.

J. Parker appointed } Sept. 8th, 1919,

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas the application of J. Parker, asking that he be appointed Public Weigher in and for Precinct No. 4 of Titus County.

It is ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that J. Parker be appointed Public Weigher in and for Precinct # 4 of Titus County, Texas, to fill the unexpired term of Sh. Halcomb.

In the Matter of Declaring }
 the Office of Justice of the Peace } Sept. 8, 1919
 in and for Prec. # 8. Vacant }

On this day, County Commissioner King offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed, which motion was seconded by Commissioner Smart. The order is as follows:

It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that J. L. Cargile, Justice of the Peace of Precinct no. 8 of Titus County, has moved out of Titus County, and that his residence is now in another County; that there is a necessity for ^{the appointment of} a Justice of the Peace in said Precinct, and in order to do so, there being no resignation of the present incumbent filed with this Court, the office must be declared vacant.

County Judge McTabb put the motion for a vote of the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no". Smart, King, Lee and Brown voted "aye" none voted "no". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

 H. B. Green Justice of the Peace } Sept. 8th, 1919

On this the 8th day of Sept. 1919 came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas ^{the application of H. B. Green} asking that he be appointed Justice of the Peace of Precinct # 8 of Titus County, Texas, to fill out the unexpired term of J. L. Cargile.

The Court after considering said application is of the opinion that H. B. Green is qualified for the place and should be appointed.

It is therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that H. B. Green be appointed Justice of the Peace in and for Precinct

No. 8 of Titus County, Texas to fill out the unexpired term of J. C. Cargill,

On the Matter of Approving }
Official Bonds. }

On this the 8th day of Sept. 1919, the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, examined the Official Bonds of the following officers, to wit: W. G.
