G. Gabb, County Judge, A. P. Smart, W. M. King, W. H. Lee, and F. B. Brown Commissioners, C. H. Neugebaur, Clerk. Court was opened by a proclamation of the Sheriff of Titus County, Texas.

On this day the Commissioners Court of Titus County, examined the Quarterly Reports of the following County and Precinct officers, to wit: H. Hammond, County Treasurer, L. B. Roach, J. P. W. W. Smith, Sheriff, F. B. Brown, J. D. C. Gaddis, Constable, W. M. Brown, Dist. Clerk, Louis E. Lee, J. P. W. M. King, J. P. W. H. Banks, Road Supt., H. B. Green, J. O. M. Hagner, Constable, C. H. Neugebaur, County Clerk and First National Bank, County Depository, and K. A. Luchter, J. P.

Commissioner Smart made a motion that the Quarterly Reports of the above named officers be in all things approved, which motion was seconded by Commissioner Lee, County Judge, J. G. Gabb put the motion for a vote of the members of said Court, with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no" Smart, Lee, King and Brown voted "aye" now voted "no"

Returns of Hospital }
 Bond Election Overlaid. }

On this the 10th day of Nov. 1919, the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas considered the returns of the Hospital Bond Election held in Titus County, Texas, on Oct. 25th 1919. The Court finds that there were 81 votes cast for the Bonds and that there were cast against the Bonds 773 votes, making a majority against the Bonds of 692 votes.

John Crain allowed }
 funds for maintenance }

On this the 10th day of Nov. 1919, Commissioner Lee made a motion that John Crain be allowed the sum of \$8.00 per month out of the General County fund of Titus County, Texas for his maintenance, which motion was seconded by Commissioner Smart. County Judge J. W. Fabb put the motion for a vote of the members of said Court with the request that as many as favored the motion to "aye" and those opposed to vote "no". All members voted "aye". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

J. R. White appointed }
 Live Stock Inspector }
 for Precinct # 3. }

On this the 10th day of NOV. 1919, Commissioner King made a motion that J. R. White be appointed Live Stock Inspector in and for Precinct no. 3 of Titus County, Texas, which motion was seconded by Commissioner Smart. County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said Court, with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no". King, Smart, Lee, & Pearson voted "aye".
