

Be it remembered that on this the 9th day of Feb. 1920 there was begun and holden a regular term of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, at the Court House thereof in the City of Mt. Pleasant, with the following members present to wit: J. W. Tabb County Judge, A. B. Smart, W. M. King, F. A. Lee and T. B. Brown, Commissioners and G. T. Neugent Clerk. Court was opened by a proclamation of the Sheriff of Titus County Texas, when the following proceedings were had to wit:

In the Matter of Tick

Eradication. On this the 9th day of Feb. 1920 came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas the matter of taking up the work of tick eradication for Titus County, when commissioner Smart made a motion that the court take up the tick eradication work and that each county commissioner of said Co., employ a suitable man or men to look after and superintend the matter of cattle dipping in his respective commissioners Precinct of said County and that J. W. Tabb be appointed to purchase material necessary for construction of vats and for dipping purposes, which motion was seconded by commissioner King. The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no" all commissioners voted "aye" none voted "no". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the matter of appointing Superintendents of cattle

dipping. On this the 9th day of Feb. 1919 commissioner Smart offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas and made a motion that the same be passed by said court which motion was seconded by commissioner King. Whereas in an order heretofore entered by the commissioners court of Titus County Texas it was directed that each county commissioner of said county employ a suitable man to look after and superintend the matter of cattle dipping in his respective commissioner's precinct of said county and authorized J. W. Tabb to purchase material necessary for construction of vats and for dipping purposes.

And whereas commissioner Brown has employed W. L. Gauntt to superintend and supervise the dipping of cattle in commissioners precinct No. 4 of Titus County, Texas. Commissioner King has employed J. R. White to superintend the dipping of cattle in commissioners precinct No. 3 of Titus County, Texas, Commissioner Lee has employed H. C. Campbell to superintend the dipping of cattle in commissioners precinct No. 2 and also has employed Ab Hood to superintend and assist in the dipping of cattle in said precinct No. 2, and commissioner Smart has employed R. H. Slayton to superintend the dipping of cattle in precinct No. 1 of Titus County Texas.

And whereas each of said commissioners has agreed to pay each of said employees \$100.00 per month for said service.

It is therefore ordered by the commissioners court of Titus County, Texas that each of said employments be in all things ratified and confirmed and that said salaries be paid on bills presented by said employees as required by law. County Judge put the motion for a vote of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no".

County Commissioner Smart, King, Lee and Brown voted "aye" The county judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the matter of employing

W.D. Eubanks to keep up

Public Roads.

On this the 9th day of Feb. 1920 came on to be considered by the commissioners court of Titus County, Texas the matter of employing W.D. Eubanks to look after the public roads and designated highways of Titus County, when commissioner Smart offered the following order to the commissioners court of Titus County Texas and made a motion that the same be passed, which motion was seconded by Commissioner King. the order is as follows, to wit. That W.D. Eubanks be employed to take charge of the road machinery and tools of Titus County and look after and work the Public Roads and Highways of Titus County and have the authority to employ labor to work on said roads; that he be paid the sum of \$100.00 per month out of the funds derived from automobile taxes and known as the automobile fund of Titus County. The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of the commissioners court of Titus County with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no". Smart, King, Lee and Brown voted Aye. none voted no. The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the matter of allowing

Pauper funds.

On this the 9th day of Feb. 1920 it is ordered by the commissioners court of Titus County Texas that Jack Harris be allowed the sum of \$12.50 per month for his support, to be paid out of the General County fund of Titus County, Texas as required by law.
