

BE IT REMEMBERED that on this the 14th day of February, A.D.1921, there was begun and holden a regular term of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas at the Court House thereof in the town of Mount Pleasant, Texas, with the following members present to wit: D.M.Cook, County Judge, W.M.Edwards, V.A.Fleming, L.N.Old and W.W.King, Commissioners, and Ulman Brown, Clerk. Court was opened by a proclamation of the Sheriff of Titus County, Texas, when the following proceedings were had to wit:

In the matter of appointing #
Inspectors of Cattle Dipping. #

On this the 14th day of February, A.D.1921, came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas the matter of taking up the work of tick eradication for Titus County, when Commissioner Old made a motion that the Court take up the tick eradication work, on the 15th day of March, 1921, and that each Commissioner of said County employ a suitable man to look after and superintend the matter of cattle dipping in his respective commissioners Precinct of said County, and that D.M.Cook be appointed to purchase material necessary for repairing vats and for dipping purposes, which motion was seconded by King. The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said Court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" all commissioners voted "Aye" none vote "No". The County Judge declared the motion carried and order passed.

In the matter of appointing #
Inspectors of Cattle dipping. #

On this the 14th day of February, 1921, Commissioners Old offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas and made a motion that the same be passed by said which motion was seconded by Commissioner King. Whereas in an order heretofore entered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas it was directed that each county commissioner of said county employ a suitable man to look after and superintend the matter of cattle dipping in his respective commissioner's precinct of said county and authorized D.M.Cook to purchase material necessary for repairing of the vats of said county, for dipping purposes.

And whereas commissioner King recommends T.T.Polk, to superintend and supervise the dipping of cattle in Commissioners precinct No. 3, of Titus County, Texas. Commissioners Old recommends D.H.Snodgrass, to superintend the dipping of cattle in Commissioners precinct No. 4, of Titus County, Texas, W.A.Fleming, recommends Marvin Harper, to superintends the dipping of cattle in Commissioners precinct No. 2, of Titus County, Texas, and W.M. Edwards Commissioner of Pre. No. 1., recommends R.H.Slayton, to superintend the dipping of cattle in precinct No. 1, Titus County, Texas,. And whereas each of said commissioners has agreed to pay each of said employees \$85.00 per month for said service.

It is therefore ordered by the commissioners court of Titus County, Texas, that each of said employments be in all things ratified and confirmed and that said salaries be paid on bills presented by said employees as required by law. The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No". County Commissioner Fleming, King, Old and Edwards voted "Aye" the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the matter of F.R.French,
Public Road.

Motion by Commissioner Fleming that the order passed at the December

Term of the Commissioner Court, of Titus County, Texas, Whereas said order is that the Public Road from F.R.French's farm to the Jefferson Highway be changed, be rescinded and said road stands as it appears now, seconded by commissioner King, and the County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" all of said Commissioners voted "Aye" and the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the matter of the Auditors #

having possession of the Records. #

Motion by Commissioner Fleming and seconded by King that the County Clerk of Titus County, turn over to the Auditors, who is auditing the Books of Titus County, all records and papers they see fit to have and let them have same to carry to their office, The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members for a vote with the request that as many favored said motion to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "No", King, Fleming, Old and Edwards all voted "Aye", The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order carried.

In matter of Mrs Fulce, Pauper, #

discontinuing allowance. #

Motion by commissioner King and seconded by Old, that Mrs. Fulce, a Pauper of said County, be taken off of the list as a Pauper and discontinue her allowance after Feb.16, 1921, the County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said commissioners Court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No", Commissioner King, Fleming and Old voted "Aye" and Commissioner Edwards, absent, The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of appointing #

County Surveyor. #

Motion by Commissioner King and seconded by Old that D.T.Parson, be appointed to the office of County Surveyor of Titus County, Texas, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No", Commissioners King, Fleming and Old voted "Aye" and Commissioner Edwards Absent, the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the matter of the resignation of *
J.F. Cooley as J.P. Pre. No. 8. * Feb. 1st, 1921. *

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas
the resignation of J.F. Cooley as Justice of the Peace of Precinct No. 8 Titus County,
Texas when Commissioner King made a motion which was seconded by Fleming that the resig-

gnation be in all things accepted. County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No". Commissioner Edwards, King, Old and Fleming all voted Aye. The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.
