No. 5, Sam Porter Justice of the Peace Pre No. 1., Ulman Brown, County Clerk, W.E.McClintock, District Clerk, John J. Reeves, Sheriff, and G.E.Dickson, County Treasurer, be in all things approved, when Commissioner King made a motion that the Quarterly reports be approved and seconded by Old, the County Judge put the motion before the Commissioners for a vote with the request that as many favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to to vote "No" King, Edwards, Fleming and Old all voted "Aye" the County Judge declared the motion carried and order passed.

In the Matter of levying
a Tax for the year of 1921.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas, the matter of levying a tax upon the real and personal property of Titus County, Texas, for the year of 1921, and Commissioner W.M.Edwards made a motion which said motion was seconded by Commissioner W.M.King, the tax-levy as follows, to-wit:-was ordered.

It is ordered by the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, that there be levied for the year of 1921, against such and every One Hundred Dollars taxable valuation of property

in Titus County, Texas in the following amounts, to wit:

For principal and interest of warrants refunding General County indebtedness, 18¢ for General Funds, 7¢; For Principal and Interest of refunding warrants of Road and Bridge indebtedness of said County, 7¢; for Roads and Bridges, 8¢; For County House and Jail purposes, 25¢; and 15¢ for Jury. Motion put by the County Judge for a vote of the said Commissioners with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No", Commissioners King, Edwards, Fleming and Old, all voted "Aye" the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of Allowing # # # February, 17th, 1921.
pay for Sheriff & Board of Prisoners #

Motion by Commissioner Edwards and seconded by Commissioner King, that John J. Reeves, Sheriff of Titus County, Texas, be allowed the sum of Seventy Five Cents (75) per day, on each Prisoner, for Boarding prisoners at the County Jail, for indefinite time and to be changed at the option of the Commissioners Court and said allowance of 75 cents per day for boarding prisoners shall be enforced from February, 1st, 1921, The County Judge put the motion before the members of the Commissioners' Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" Commissioners King, Fleming, Edwards and Old, all voted "Aye" and the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of Appointing a # # # February, 17th, 1921.
County Health Officer.

On this the 17th day of February, 1921, came on to be considered the application of Dr. S.R. Crabtree asking that he be appointed County Health Officer for Titus County, for the year of 1921, and the Court after due consideration is of the opinion that the said Dr. Crabtree is a suitable person and should be appointed. It is therefore ordered and adjudged by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas that the said DR. S.R. Crabtree be appointed County Health Officer for Titus County for the year 1921 and that he be paid for his services out of the General County fund upon bill presented by him as required by law.

In the Matter of Returning Road Trucks # # # Feb. 17th, 1921.
and Selling County Mules.

Motion by Commissioner Fleming and seconded by Commissioner Old that the County Road Trucks be returned by back to the State Highway Department, Three Trucks One Nash Engine No. 65650, One F.W.D. Engine No. 12326 and One Nash Engine No. 63400, and that the County sell the County Road Mules, The County Judge put the motion before the Commissioners Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" County Commissioner Edwards, Absent, and Fleming and Old voted "Aye" and King vote "No", the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of allowing # # # February, 17th, 1921.
Quittie Mims Janitor during District Court. #

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioner Court of Titus County, Texas, Quittie Mims, Janitor at the Court House and extra Allowance for the January Term of of The District Court of 1921, when commissioner Old made a motion to allow him \$10.00,

which motion was seconded by King, the County Judge put the motion before the members for a vote with a request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" Commissioners King, Old and Fleming all voted "Aye" Commissioner Edwards Absent, the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of appointing #
J.B. Garrett Road Superintendent. # February, 17th, 1921.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, a Road Superintendent of Titus County, Texas, when Commissioner King made a motion that J.B. Garrett be appointed and to be paid \$125.00 per month to be paid out of the Automobile Fund to superintend the Highways of Titus County, Texas, for an indefinite time at the option of this court as to the time and salary of the said Garrett, Seconded by Commissioner Old, the County put the motion before the members of said Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" Commissioners King, Fleming and Old all voted "Aye" and Commissioner Edwards Absent, the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of Registering #
Road Bonds. # February, 17th, 1921.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, Road Bonds should be registered in the County Treasurer Office, Titus County, Texas, and it appearing to the Court that there is about 225 Road Bonds in the County Treasurer office that had never been registered on the County Treasurer books, and that Commissioner Edwards made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner King, that G.B. Dickson be allowed the sum 20¢ each for registering said bonds and that the County Clerk draw a warrant on the general County Fund for said service when the registering is completed, the County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of the Commissioners Court with the request that the as many favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No", commissioners King, Fleming, Edwards and Old all voted "Aye" the county Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.
